Learners must qualify for the program by taking the GED[®] orientation/assessment.

This college preparation program is for learners without a high school credential. The goal of the program is that the student obtains the GED[®] credential, enters postsecondary education or training, and tests out of or into the last level of one subject (reading, writing or math) on the ACCUPLACER college placement exam.

This class enables students to obtain the education they need and to secure a good-paying job to support themselves and their families.

The program provides:

- Instruction in reading, writing, social studies, science and math for the GED[®] test battery. The class prepares students to be ready to take college-level coursework when entering post-secondary education or training.
- Independent study opportunities that include tutoring and counseling.
- College preparation and college knowledge skills.
