# **Admissions Guidelines**

### Minimum requirements to apply to the Nursing program:

- I. CCRI Application for Enrollment into General Studies with a pre-nursing concentration.
- 2. Official copy of a high school transcript, GED® transcript or baccalaureate transcript from an accredited institution, including date of graduation or completion.
- 3. ACCUPLACER test issued by CCRI's Department of Advising and Counseling.
  - Score of 90 or above is required for Reading Comprehension **OR** ENGL 0890: Critical Reading with a grade of "B-" or better.
  - Score of 65 or above is required for Math (Arithmetic) **OR** MATH 0100: Fundamentals of Mathematics with a grade of "B-" or better
- 4. HESI A<sup>2</sup> Test. Score 75 percent or better on each section.\*
- 5. Complete the following required prerequisite courses. (These courses are limited to two attempts.)
  - BIOL 1010: Human Anatomy with a grade of "B-" or better
  - ENGL 1010: Composition I with a grade of "C" or better
  - PSYC 2010: General Psychology with a grade of "C" or better

Note: All attempts prior to Jan. 1, 2015, including transfers, are considered ONE attempt regardless of the number of times the class was taken. If a student fails to meet the satisfactory grade requirements within the two attempts, the student must wait five years from the last attempt to retake the course.

6. A minimum overall cumulative grade point average of 2.7 is required to apply to the program and be maintained until enrolled in Nursing.

All the above requirements must be met satisfactorily BEFORE submission of the Performance-Based Health Science (PBHS) application and does not guarantee acceptance. Students declining acceptance into the program for the semester must resubmit a PBHS application for the program and meet current requirements. Once accepted into the Nursing program, the student must attend a mandatory orientation conducted by the Nursing Department.

- 7. Complete and submit an online PBHS application at www.ccri.edu/oes/admissions/performancebasedapplications.html. Deadlines are listed on the form.
- 8. Conditionally accepted students are required to complete the following:
  - When directed by notification from the Office of Enrollment Services, submit a background check through <u>CastleBranch.com</u>. Results of BCI may prevent admission due to clinical agencies' requirements.
  - Submit all health care requirements to <u>CastleBranch.com</u> by the deadline identified.

#### Final acceptance is based upon completion of the above criteria.

\* HESI A<sup>2</sup>: If the student does not achieve a 75 percent on one or more of the tests, he or she may retake the necessary test(s) once within the next 12 months. Students are limited to two attempts within a 12-month period from the date the original test was taken. A minimum of two weeks between exams is required. **Please note: HESI test scores do not expire.**
