### Become a Promise Scholar.

Enroll at the Community College of Rhode Island in Fall 2019 and become a Promise Scholar. Through the Rhode Island Promise scholarship, Rhode Islanders graduating from high school in 2019 are eligible to pursue associate degrees at CCRI tuition-free.

That's right: Regardless of your family income, you won't pay tuition at CCRI.

#### Eligibility for Rhode Island Promise 2019

- Rhode Island residents.\*
- 2019 high school graduates (public, private or homeschooled) or GED® recipients younger than 19 years old.†

#### How to maintain the scholarship for two years

- Enroll full time.
- Earn 30 credits each year.
- Enroll each semester for two years.
- Fall and spring are required.
- Maintain at least a 2.5 GPA.

†Students who graduated from high school at ages 19, 20 or 21 may be eligible if there is a documented reason for late graduation.

Apply to a degree program at CCRI and for the Rhode Island Promise scholarship.	By December 2018	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Visit <a href="http://ccri.edu/apply">ccri.edu/apply</a>.</li> </ul>
Complete and submit the FAFSA.	By December 2018	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Visit <a href="http://fafsa.ed.gov">fafsa.ed.gov</a>.</li> <li>Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and use CCRI's school code: <b>004916</b>.</li> <li>If you have questions or need assistance completing the FAFSA, contact the RI Educational Opportunity Center (EOC) at 401-455-6028 or the College Planning Center at 401-736-3170.</li> <li>If you are randomly selected for FAFSA verification, you will be asked to provide specific documentation to confirm that your FAFSA information is correct. Contact CCRI Financial Aid for assistance with verification at 401-825-2468 or <a href="mailto:ccrifafaq@ccri.edu">ccrifafaq@ccri.edu</a></li> <li>Check your MyCCRI portal to make sure all financial aid steps have been completed.</li> </ul>
Complete the online orientation.	By December 2018	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Visit <a href="http://ccri.edu/orientation">ccri.edu/orientation</a>.</li> <li>Complete the new student online orientation module.</li> </ul>
Submit your mid-year transcript.	February 2019	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Request to have your transcript sent to CCRI by your school counselor.</li> <li>Mid-year transcripts provide helpful information to ensure best course placement.</li> </ul>
Submit your SAT or ACT scores.	Upon completion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Submit your official or unofficial SAT or ACT test reports. Though not required for admission, this step is strongly recommended to ensure best course placement.</li> <li>Please mail test reports to the Office of Enrollment Services at any CCRI campus.</li> </ul>
Take the ACCUPLACER assessment.	February 2019	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Call CCRI Advising and Counseling at <b>401-825-1240</b> to schedule an appointment for your placement test.</li> <li>Information about the assessment and prep resources are available at <a href="http://ccri.edu/advising">ccri.edu/advising</a>.</li> </ul>
Register for Fall 2019 courses.	Registration opens April 8, 2019	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Once you have completed the ACCUPLACER, you will be scheduled for a <b>New Student Registration session</b> where you'll meet with an advisor, develop an education plan and register for classes.</li> </ul>
Submit your official, final high school transcript or GED®.	June 2019	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Each transcript must be submitted in a <b>signed, sealed envelope</b> to the Office of Enrollment Services at any CCRI campus, or submitted directly to CCRI by your school counselor.</li> <li><b>Graduation date</b> should be noted on the transcript.</li> </ul>
