ABOUT CCRI

The Community College of Rhode Island opened its doors in 1964 with 325 students in a temporary space on Promenade Street in Providence as Rhode Island Junior College. Today, with four campuses throughout the state, CCRI enrolls an average of more than 14,000 credit students each semester, making it the largest comprehensive community college in New England.

Forty percent of its students identify themselves as part of a minority group, many of whom are the first in their families to attend college. Accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, CCRI offers more than 100 degree and certificate programs in the arts, business, computer studies, engineering, health sciences, human services, liberal arts, and science departments taught by faculty who are experts in their field.

Each year, Rhode Islanders fill more than 40,000 seats in our professional development, skill enhancement, job retraining, and noncredit personal enrichment courses offered by CCRI's Division of Workforce Partnerships. CCRI students are active participants in campus life and in the community. The college offers a varsity athletic program with sports and a diverse selection of student clubs and organizations, including student government.

Annually, students, faculty and staff volunteer for a variety of Rhode Island non-profit organizations, making life better for those less fortunate. Since its inception, CCRI has graduated more than 68,000 students, with 95 percent of them living and working in Rhode Island. The college is the No. 1 provider of nurses and other health care workers in the state.

Additionally, more than 1,000 CCRI students per year transfer to Rhode Island College and the University of Rhode Island to continue their education. CCRI's tuition is the most affordable in Rhode Island. A full-time student pays approximately half, or less, the cost of tuition and fees charged at any other college in the state.

According to a recent survey given to exiting students, when graduates were asked, "Would you recommend CCRI to a friend or family member?" nearly 99 percent said yes. By preparing students to continue their education or to enter the state's work force, the Community College of Rhode Island provides its students with the opportunity to change their lives and achieve their dreams.

The CCRI Knight Campus is home to the Vincent A. Cullen Field House with four basketball courts, four tennis courts, three volleyball courts and a fully-equipped weight room. The men's and women's basketball teams play their home games on the center wood court. Athletic Department administration, coaches and staff have offices at this location.

The CCRI baseball team plays its home games at Harold "Whitey" Fell Field, named in honor of the college's former head baseball coach.

The Knight Campus has two additional outdoor fields for team practice and recreational use.

The CCRI Flanagan Campus has a field house with four basketball courts, four tennis courts, four volleyball courts, a six-lane swimming pool, an indoor track, a modern dance studio and a fully-equipped weight room. The women's volleyball team plays its home matches in the Flanagan Campus Field House. Athletic Department administration, coaches and staff have offices at this location.

The Flanagan Campus has several outdoor fields for team practice and competition as well as recreational use. The cross country team and the men's and women's soccer teams host their home meets and matches at this site.



Additional sites

Some CCRI teams play their home games at nearby off-campus locations. The softball team plays its home games at Winslow Park Field in Warwick and the golf team competes and practices at Cranston Country Club. The coed tennis team and the indoor and outdoor track teams travel to their opponent's site or a neutral site for matches.

AN OVERVIEW OF CCRI ATHLETICS PAST AND PRESENT

The Community College of Rhode Island is home to one of the Ocean State's finest and most successful intercollegiate athletic programs.

Since its inception in 1965, CCRI has long been considered a front-runner in New England community college and junior college athletic circles. The basketball, baseball, tennis, volleyball, cross country, golf, and soccer teams have all been nationally ranked. The 2002 women's soccer team captured the school's first national championship, while a number of other squads, including men's basketball and women's soccer, were national runners-up.

With more than 5,500 victories, 222 All-Americans, 128 Region XXI championships, and 835 All-Region selections, CCRI leads the way among all New England community colleges.

Great coaching has been the key to CCRI's success. From the athletic department's humble beginnings in 1965, the school has always featured legendary coaches. With Hall of Fame Athletic Director and men's basketball coach Vin Cullen; baseball coaches Ken Hopkins, Whitey Fell, and Art Pontarelli; tennis coach Ray Carr; and volleyball coach Gail Davis, the tradition of great coaches and top-flight teaching has extended through the years and continues to this day.

The college is also a member of the National Junior College Athletic Association and an associate member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. CCRI fields intercollegiate men's teams in baseball, basketball, soccer, cross country, indoor and outdoor track, and golf and intercollegiate women's teams in volleyball, basketball, cross country, indoor and outdoor track, soccer, and softball.

In addition to intercollegiate sports, CCRI offers four sports at the club level: men's volleyball, swimming, women's beach volleyball, and eSports. The Community College of Rhode Island has proven to be a stepping stone for many student athletes who have moved on to complete their academic and athletic careers at four-year colleges and universities throughout the nation.

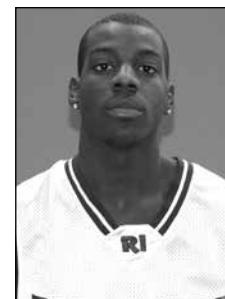

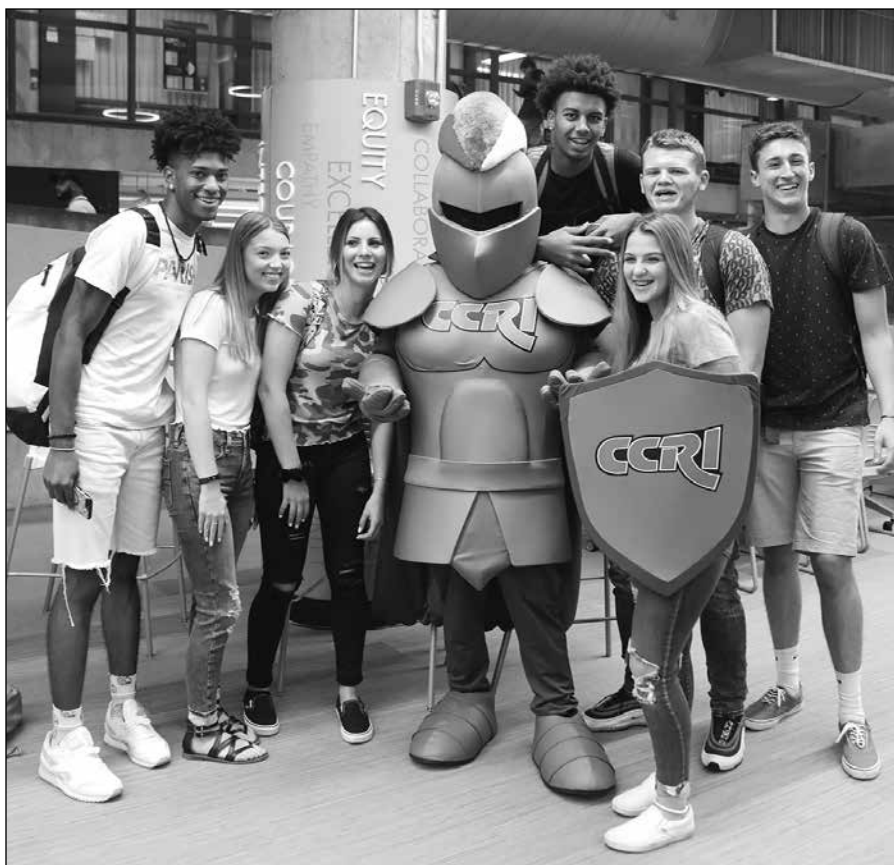

SEASON OUTLOOK

Moving from Division I to D-III, the 2021 men's soccer team looks to change its fortune under head coach Gabe Toro, who enters his 11th season at CCRI.

Due to the pandemic and the ensuing one year lay-off, the Knights have only one returning player – the all-important co-captain and goalkeeper Ednilson Tavares (Pawtucket, RI). He will be joined as a captain by freshman All-State midfielder Wilson Penafiel (Providence, RI) and talented freshman forward Pablo Puac (Pawtucket, RI). The three will provide leadership and top-notch talent at all three levels of the playing field for the Knights.

Joining the co-captains is a bumper crop of talented freshmen who will look to bolster the team's offensive efforts while providing a solid defensive backline. Puac will be looked upon to create scoring opportunities from the midfield along with freshmen strikers Ricardo Foster (Cranston, RI) and First Team All-Division striker Diego Alvarez (West Warwick, RI). Sebastian Coso (Pawtucket, RI) will offer tremendous ball skills while forward Joe Dorce (Providence, RI) will utilize his size to hold up the ball and help maintain possession. Busime Yosta (Pawtucket, RI) offers speed and agility.

Joustin Rivera (Providence, RI) will split time between midfield and forward. Leading the midfield corps will be Penafiel, who will look to help the Knights maintain possession while linking up the backline with the frontline. Another key midfielder will be Aaron Ramos (Warwick, RI), who has a powerful shot and will look to create scoring opportunities from long distance and provide a left-footed option on corner kicks. Two other dynamic midfielder for the Knights will be Daniel Tinoco (Providence, RI) and Thiago Pereira (North Providence, RI).

The defensive corps will be led by All-Division defender Matt Gibeau (Warwick, RI), who has tremendous man-marking ability along with a nose for the ball. He will be joined by Ethan McDermott (Cumberland RI), another tenacious defender who will help provide a formidable back line in front of goalkeepers Tavares and Alex Johnson (West Warwick, RI). Joining Gibeau and McDermott is All-Division defender Fabian Mueller (North Kingstown, RI) along with Adnel Lopez (Cranston, RI), Nick Guertin (Cranston, RI), and Cristian Gaviria (Cranston, RI), all of whom will be in the defensive rotation for CCRI.

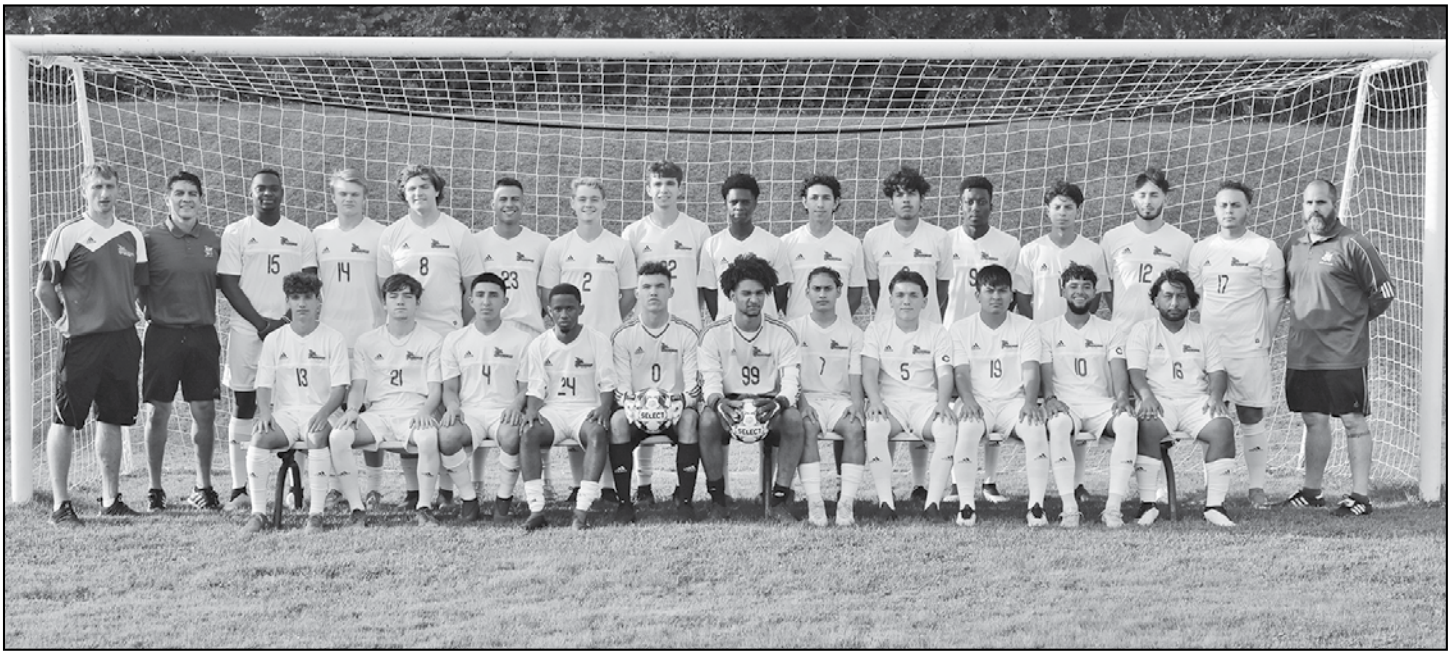

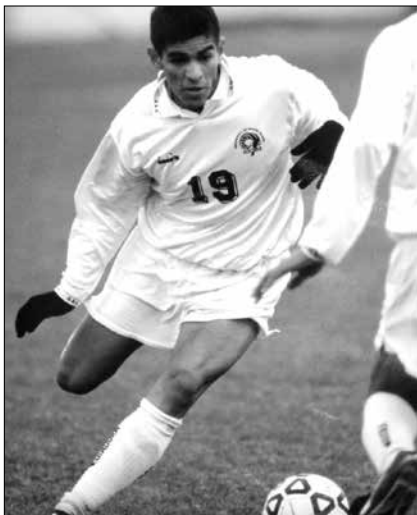
Gabriel Toro Head Coach



Gabriel Toro returns for his 12th season as head coach of the CCRI men's soccer program. He previously served as assistant coach of the program for two years under Victor Gaspar. Toro, a native of Colombia and a 1999 graduate of the University of Rhode Island, strives to continue the program's winning tradition. In addition to his coaching experience at CCRI, Toro has organized and coached clinics in Rhode Island and Massachusetts for boys and girls of all ages, with a focus on eliminating technical weaknesses and enhancing

players' strengths to improve their confidence and technical skills. In 2001, he led the Tolman High School boys' soccer team to a second-place finish in the state tournament. Toro has extensive playing experience with the semi-pro Lusitana Portuguese Club in Cumberland and the Providence Soccer League.

After graduating from URI with a bachelor's degree in psychology, he played three seasons for the Rhode Island Stingrays. At URI, he was a member of the No. 3-ranked men's team that garnered a record of 19-1-3 and won Atlantic-10 championship titles in 1995 and 1996. He was honored with the Bob Butler Sportsmanship Award in 1998.

Mike Jerue Assistant Coach



Mike Jerue returns for his 11th year as assistant coach and his eighth with coach Toro's staff; he was previously the assistant to former men's soccer coach Victor Gaspar. Jerue played at CCRI in 1999 and is a former Region XXI championship goalkeeper.

A former teammate of Toro's with the Lusitana Portuguese Club, Jerue has extensive training and knowledge playing both semi-pro and professional soccer. He has more than 30 years of experience with goalkeepers, which is his main focus on the coaching staff. He is also the co-founder of the MK Goalkeeping Academy in West Warwick. Jerue has coached at many levels, ranging from youth to high school to college. He recently began his third year as a coach for the North American Soccer League's Rhode Island Reds FC.

Rafal Murawski Assistant Coach



Rafal Murawski returns for his third year as an assistant coach for the CCRI men's soccer program.

A longtime professional standout in Poland and England, Murawski began playing at 5 years old. His talent was evident at a young age by his peers in Lezajsk, Poland, and he was

soon drafted onto the town's competitive youth teams at the age of 9. He eventually rose through the ranks and competed on a number of all-star teams in Poland between the ages of 13 and 16.

By the time Murawski was a young teenager, he was fully dedicated to developing his soccer career; he moved away from his family to complete his high school education at a soccer school in Krakow, Poland, where he was coached by professionals and learned unique special training techniques. After completing soccer school, Murawski played at the semi-professional and professional level for nine years on third- and fourth-division teams in Poland and England. His soccer career lasted more than two decades and ended in 2015 following a series of injuries.

SEASON OUTLOOK

Under the direction of head coach Pat Chin, the Knights are poised to compete for their first regional title since 2016.

Chin will be working with an entirely new cast of players; there are no returnees from 2019, which is the last time the Knights took the court due to COVID-19, but the players joining the 2021 squad are more than ready to succeed in the postseason.

Leading the way for the Knights are their two co-captains, outside hitter **Madison Capwell** (Coventry, RI) and setter **Kelsey Conway** (Coventry, RI). Both come to CCRI from Rhode Island High School Volleyball juggernaut Coventry High School, where they learned some of their trade from former CCRI assist record-holder Jill Krebs. Both players also have a wealth of experience between their high school play and growing up on the club volleyball circuit and will provide talent and leadership to the 2021 team.

The freshmen co-captains will have plenty of talent surrounding them, including outside hitter **Savanna Martinez** (Central Falls, RI) and middle blocker **Courtney Essex** (South Kingstown, RI). Martinez comes to CCRI from a well-respected Central Falls squad and will look to use her athleticism to score for the Knights while also offering the occasional help with a dig here and there. Essex will provide size defensively as the tallest player on the roster while offering another outlet to create kills with her length and technique. Outside hitters **Kara Conway** (Burrillville, RI) and **Taysia Hatch** (Riverside, RI) also look to bolster the CCRI offensive attack. Freshman **Libero Aliana Winn** (Lincoln, RI) looks to shore up CCRI's defense in the back row while also offering potent service from the back line to provide instant offense.

The Knights have a very competitive division with the likes of Northern Essex CC and Massasoit CC, who always provide problems for CCRI, however, with this new influx of talent along with the tutelage of Chin, the Knights are primed for postseason success.

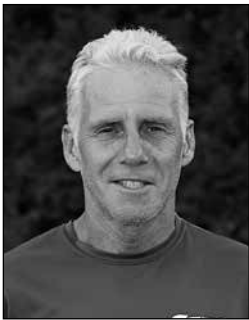

COACHING STAFF *for indoor track, outdoor track and cross country*

Gregg Cornell '84

Head Coach



CCRI alumnus **Gregg Cornell**, the school's longest-tenured coach, enters his 33rd season as the cross country and outdoor track and field coach and his 19th as the indoor track coach, beginning with the latter's inception in 2002. His drive, knowledge and teaching skills have combined to produce several stand-out athletes at the college.

During his career, Cornell has coached 12 NJCAA Division III

All-Americans and more than 25 All-District runners. The men's team has placed in the top three at the Northeast District Meet five times and in the top 10 at the NJCAA Division III National Championship three times.

Cornell has been a runner for more than 30 years. As a student at CCRI, he was the college's first All-New England cross country runner in 1982 and was named to the All-New England team for two consecutive seasons. Cornell was a member of CCRI's first two New England title teams and was voted CCRI Athlete of the Year for the 1983-84 season. He is still recognized as one of the best runners in the college's history.

Cornell continued his running career at Bridgewater State University, where he earned Division III All-American honors in 1986 and was named Bridgewater State's Athlete of the Year for the 1986-87 season. His success carried over to marathons, and he became one of the state's best long-distance runners by winning the Cape Cod Marathon in 1995 and the Ocean State Marathon in 1991.

The college presented Cornell with the Distinguished Alumnus Award during the Rhode Island Legislative Scholar-Athlete Awards ceremony at the State House in April of 2010. He previously received special recognition in 1989 when he was inducted into the CCRI Athletic Hall of Fame.

Hunter Stewart '07

Assistant Coach



Hunter Stewart, who competed for CCRI's cross country and indoor and outdoor track and field teams, will serve as assistant coach of the cross-country team for his 11th season.

At CCRI, Stewart was a member of the 2005 Northeast District Championship cross country team and the first-ever CCRI indoor track Northeast District Championship team in 2006. He was the indoor

track 600-meter district champion in 2006 and 2007, and the outdoor track 800m and 4x800m district champion in 2007. He also received All-District honors in cross country in 2006 and in the outdoor track 800m event in 2007. Stewart holds CCRI indoor track records in the 500m (1:08.75) and the 600m (1:25.15). He shares the 4x800m relay record (8:41.25) with Kevin White, Joe Hannon, and Bryan Galvin.

An excellent student, Stewart was a recipient of the Rhode Island Legislative Scholar-Athlete Award while at CCRI. He transferred to Rhode Island College to compete in all three running sports, earning All-Alliance/Little East honors as a junior and senior. Also as a senior, he was named captain and junior assistant coach of the cross country and indoor track teams. He graduated from RIC with a bachelor's degree in English in 2010. Stewart runs for the Providence Cobras racing and track and field teams.
