ABOUT CCRI

The Community College of Rhode Island opened its doors in 1964 with 325 students in a temporary space on Promenade Street in Providence as Rhode Island Junior College. Today, with four campuses throughout the state, CCRI enrolls an average of more than 14,000 credit students each semester, making it the largest comprehensive community college in New England. Forty percent of its students identify themselves as part of a minority group, many of whom are the first in their families to attend college.

Accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, CCRI offers more than 100 degree and certificate programs in the arts, business, computer studies, engineering, health sciences, human services, liberal arts and science departments taught by faculty who are experts in their field. Each year, Rhode Islanders fill more than 40,000 seats in our professional development, skill enhancement, job retraining and noncredit personal enrichment courses offered by CCRI's Center for Workforce and Community Education.

CCRI students are active participants in campus life and in the community. The college offers a varsity athletic program with sports and a diverse selection of student clubs and organizations, including student government. Annually, students, faculty and staff volunteer for a variety of Rhode Island nonprofit organizations, making life better for those less fortunate.

Since its inception, CCRI has graduated more than 68,000 students, with 95 percent of them living and working in Rhode Island. The college is the No. I provider of nurses and other health care workers in the state. Annually, more than 1,000 CCRI students transfer to Rhode Island College and the University of Rhode Island to continue their education.

CCRI's tuition is the most affordable in Rhode Island. A full-time student pays about half, or less, of tuition and fees charged at any other college in the state. According to a recent survey given to exiting students, when graduates were asked, "Would you recommend CCRI to a friend or family member?" nearly 99 percent said yes. By preparing students for continued education or to enter the state's work force, the Community College of Rhode Island provides its students with the opportunity to change their lives and achieve their dreams.

ACADEMICS

CCRI'S STUDENT-ATHLETE ACADEMIC SUPPORT PROGRAM (SAASP)

The Student-Athlete Academic Support Program at the Community College of Rhode Island provides a support system for academic success in college. This mandatory program prepares student-athletes for transfer to four-year institutions where they can continue their education and athletic careers.

During the first semester of their freshman year, student-athletes are required to complete academic placement tests in reading, writing and mathematics and enroll in a one-credit CCRI student success course. The program requires student-athletes to attend two, one-hour study sessions each week during the semester, including the off-season, at the college's academic success centers. The Department of Athletics compliance officer schedules session times for each student-athlete and monitors their progress every five weeks during the semester. The program also provides daily academic advising, counseling and tutorials as well as transfer counseling.

Prospective student-athletes are encouraged to visit staff, coaches and advisors at CCRI's Warwick and Lincoln campuses to learn more about the program and the college's varsity teams. Call the Department of Athletics at 401-825-2114 for an appointment.

ATHLETICS AT CCRI

AN OVERVIEW OF CCRI ATHLETICS PAST AND PRESENT

The Community College of Rhode Island is home to one of the Ocean State's finest and most successful intercollegiate athletic programs. Since its inception in 1965, the CCRI program has long been considered a front-runner in New England community college and junior college athletic circles.

The basketball, baseball, tennis, volleyball, cross country, golf and soccer teams have all been nationally ranked. The 2002 women's soccer team captured the school's first national championship, while a number of other squads, including men's basketball and women's soccer, were national runners-up. With nearly 5,500 victories, 222 All-Americans, I27 Region XXI championships and 828 All-Region selections, CCRI leads the way among all New England community colleges.

Great coaching has been the key to CCRI's success. From the athletic department's humble beginnings in 1965, the school has always featured legendary coaches. From Hall of Fame athletic director and men's basketball coach Vin Cullen to baseball coaches Ken Hopkins, Whitey Fell and Art Pontarelli, tennis coach Ray Carr and volleyball coach Gail Davis, the tradition of great coaches and top-flight teaching has extended through the years and continues through the present day.

The college holds membership in the National Junior College Athletic Association and is an associate member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

CCRI fields intercollegiate men's teams in baseball, basketball, soccer, cross country, indoor and outdoor track and golf and intercollegiate women's teams in volleyball, basketball, cross country, indoor and outdoor track, soccer and-softball. In addition to our intercollegiate sports CCRI offers four sports at the club level: men's volleyball, swimming, women's beach volleyball and eSports.

The Community College of Rhode Island has proven to be a steppingstone for many student athletes who have moved on to complete their academic and athletic careers at four-year colleges and universities throughout the nation.



SEASON OUTLOOK

Following a shortened season in 2018 that featured only six games, the Knights are looking to reclaim their throne as one of the top programs in the northeast in Division I NJCAA women's soccer.

This year's group includes five returnees from 2018 paired with five top-line recruits to strengthen the lineup.


Captain **Ariana Douglas** (East Greenwich, R.I.) will be leaned upon heavily this year, not only as a leader, but as a versatile player with the ability to patrol midfield or shift to the back line to secure the Knights' defense. Another team leader, goalkeeper **Maddie Brassard** (Pawtucket, R.I.) is an excellent presence in net and will keep opponents at bay as CCRI looks to strengthen its defense in 2019.

Joining Douglas and Brassard are **Lailah Insisiengmay** (Woonsocket, R.I.) a talented midfielder who has a nose for the ball and always finds herself in the middle of the action, and **Caysie Gautreau** (Burrillville, R.I.), a winger and wide-attacking player with the ability and versatility to both provide offense on her own and get her teammates involved. The final returnee is **Veronica Lopez** (Providence, R.I.), who will play midfield and provide depth and leadership.

Joining the talented sophomores will be five high-impact freshmen looking to help the Knights get to the next level. This group is led by **McKenna Leahy** (Warwick, R.I.), a forward and midfielder who was a heavily-recruited player with goal-scoring ability and the vision to set others up to score. Midfielder and back **Monique DaFonseca** (Providence, R.I.)

is an extremely athletic player who can cover the entire field penalty box to penalty box. Center back **Juliana Capraro** (Foster, R.I.) will look to anchor the defense as a tough-nosed, athletic defender who reads the game extremely well.

Winger Giulia Marsella (Warwick, R.I.) is an energetic attacking player who will look to provide offense for the Knights. Rounding out the high-impact freshmen is **Brianna** Jarrett (Westerly, R.I.), a defender who has a physical presence and ability to slow down the opponents' attacks. Joining them will be Jezz Nunes (Warren, R.I.), a talented forward who will provide speed and athleticism at the top of the offense, and freshman Adriana Lima (Pawtucket, R.I.), who will help out in the midfield both defensively and by getting the ball transitioned to the Knights' scoring threats up top.



DID YOU KNOW?

The Lady Knights reached the NJCAA Division I National Championship in 2009 led by All-Americans Melody Lawrence at goal-keeper and Steph Morse in the midfield.



The team won the National Championship in 2002 and finished as runner-up in 2003. The women's soccer team is the only program at CCRI to win a national championship.

Since its first season in 1994, the team has compiled a 300-105-16 record, including 17 Region XXI Championships and five district championships.



COACHING STAFF

Jim McGirr Head Coach



Jim McGirr returns to CCRI for his third year as head coach after leading the Knights to a 3-3 record in 2018. Despite a shorter season due to injuries and postponements, CCRI is heading in the right direction under McGirr's guidance.

McGirr boasts 17 years of Division I NCAA coaching experience, including stints at Providence College, University of Rhode Island, Villanova University, Rutgers University, Loyola University Maryland and Lafayette College.

Most recently, he served as an assistant coach

at Loyola University, where he was in charge of recruiting and responsible for organizing and coaching, in-season daily training, functional training, team strategy and match preparation. He also helped with education and preparation through video analysis.

While at Loyola, the Greyhounds were a 2014 Patriot League quarter-finalist and 2015 semifinalist. Before Loyola, he was a volunteer assistant at the University of Rhode Island for a year and previously served as the head coach for the Providence College women's soccer program for eight seasons. While at PC, he trained and developed five different Big East All-Conference players and reached the quarterfinals of the 2011 Big East Tournament. The Friars also earned NCAA Public Recognition Awards for academic performance in 2005, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2011 and 2012. In addition, McGirr's teams achieved a 100-percent graduation rate through mandatory team study halls and weekly academic player meetings.

McGirr also has an extensive club soccer background spanning two decades. For the past two years, he has coached in the New England Futbol Club as head coach of the UI3 and UI5 girls and UI4 boys teams in addition to serving as the assistant administrator in charge of organizing and coordinating all holiday soccer clinics. He also has served as head coach of the Elite Clubs National League as head coach and trainer of the Scorpions Soccer Club from 2011 to 2013. He also worked on the regional staff as coach and trainer of the Rhode Island Olympic Development Program from 2006 to 2009.

In college, McGirr was a defender on the soccer team at Division I Rider University in New Jersey, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology in 1992. He earned his Premier Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and is licensed in United Soccer Federation "B." McGirr resides in Smithfield, R.I., with his wife Erin, who also has an athletic background as a former two-sport athlete at Rutgers University in track and soccer. He enjoys boating and golfing in his free time.

Mike Trudeau Associate Coach



Mike Trudeau returns to CCRI for his second year as an assistant coach.

Trudeau has 25 years of coaching experience at various levels from youth to high school to college. He also coached in the Rhode Island Special Olympics development

program.

Trudeau has coached both male and female teams during his career and specializes in goal-keeper training. He holds coaching certifications with the United States Soccer Federation with a National D License and National Soccer Coaches Association of America Level I and 2 Goalkeeping Diplomas. Some of the programs he has worked with include Bruno United FC, Johnson & Wales University, Bryant University and Bishop Hendricken High School.

Trudeau is a graduate of Franklin Pierce University, where he played as a Division II goalkeeper on a team that ranked as high as No. 4 nationally and finished as a national semi-finalist in 1991. He currently resides in West Warwick, R.I.

2018 SEASON SUMMARY

With injuries and weather postponements throughout the year, the 2018 women's soccer season lasted just six games for CCRI. The Knights finished 3-3, starting with an impressive, 14-0 win over Bunker Hill Community College in their season opener in which **Kat Raposo** set a new single-game record with seven goals.

Following a loss to American International College, the Knights bounced back with a 1-0 win over Central Maine Community College in which **Sam Muller** scored the lone goal to secure the victory.

CCRI's up-and-down season continued with a 2-0 loss to Southern Maine Community College followed by yet another 1-0 win, this time against Region XXI rival Holyoke Community College. Raposa, the team MVP in 2018, scored the game-winner.

Despite the myriad of cancellations, the Knights showed promise under head coach Jim McGirr and played competitively throughout the season.

Gabriel Toro Head Coach



2018 SEASON SUMMARY

Gonzalez, Sawyer, Leander and Diouf earned spots on the 2018 Division I All-Region XXI Soccer team. The Knights fell just short of the Region XXI Championship, losing to Massasoit 5-2 in the final game of the regular season.





SEASON OUTLOOK

CCRI will benefit from its established chemistry as the new players grow into their roles.

Also joining the Knights in 2019 is **Alexis Baffoni** (Coventry, R.I.), a talented outside hitter from perennial volleyball power Coventry High. **Sydney Trudeau** (Cumberland, R.I.) will also look to provide kills from the outside hitter position. **Mia Shola** (North Kingstown, R.I.), who played for the defending Rhode Island State Champions North Kingstown High School, will play libero for CCRI and contribute defensively. Rounding out this year's team is defensive specialist **Makayla Lorusso** (Woonsocket, R.I.), setter **Joanna Wong** (Cranston, R.I.) and defensive specialist **Libby Reyes** (Providence, R.I.).

The Knights have the talent and leadership to achieve their goal of winning the district and returning to the NJCAA Division II National Championship. The goal is to play as a cohesive unit and continue to improve with each game and practice.







2018 SEASON SUMMARY

The Knights had a strong, but somewhat inconsistent, first season under new head coach Pat Chin, finishing 11-13 overall despite a young roster forced to develop quickly and learn to play as a cohesive unit in a new system.

The team enjoyed several noteworthy victories in the first half of the season, including a 3-1 win over district rival Harcum College and two wins over perennial powerhouse Howard College by 3-0 and 3-1 scores. The Knights also shut out Southern Maryland twice, 3-0, and earned shutouts against the Community College of Beaver County, CCBC Essex and Word of Life Bible School.

In addition to the big time national victories they had the Lady Knights also faired very well versus Region XXI. CCRI defeated MassBay Community College, 3-0, Bunker Hill CC, 3-0, and Northern Essex CC, 3-0.

Captain and team MVP **Sam Elkas** stood out the most in 2018. Undoubtedly the team's leader on and off the court, Elkas commanded respect with her performance and attitude and finished the season with 96 kills, 31 aces, 35 digs, and 21 solo blocks for 149 total points.

No one scored more points than **Ivelisse Serrano**, who led the team with 133 kills, 49 aces, and 199 digs while also adding nine blocks for a team-high 191 points. Setter **Danielle D'Andrea** was another key component to the team's success as she directed the offense with 445 assists while also adding 134 digs, 24 kills and 34 aces. **Jasharilee Diaz** added 100 kills, eight aces and five solo blocks for 113 total points.




