

ABOUT CCRI

The Community College of Rhode Island opened its doors in 1964 with 325 students in a temporary space on Promenade Street in Providence as Rhode Island Junior College. Today, with four campuses throughout the state, CCRI enrolls an average of more than 14,000 credit students each semester, making it the largest comprehensive community college in New England.

Forty percent of its students identify themselves as part of a minority group, many of whom are the first in their families to attend college. Accredited by the New England Associ-

ation of Schools and Colleges, CCRI offers more than 100 degree and certificate programs in the arts, business, computer studies, engineering, health sciences, human services, liberal arts, and science departments taught by faculty who are experts in their field.

Each year, Rhode Islanders fill more than 40,000 seats in our professional development, skill enhancement, job retraining, and noncredit personal enrichment courses offered by CCRI's Division of Workforce Partnerships. CCRI students are active participants in campus life and in the community. The college offers a varsity athletic program with sports and a diverse selection of student clubs and organizations, including student government.

Annually, students, faculty and staff volunteer for a variety of Rhode Island non-profit organizations, making life better for those less fortunate. Since its inception, CCRI has graduated more than 68,000 students, with 95 percent of them living and working in Rhode Island. The college is the No. I provider of nurses and other health care workers in the state.

Additionally, more than I,000 CCRI students per year transfer to Rhode Island College and the University of Rhode Island to continue their education. CCRI's tuition is the most affordable in Rhode Island. A full-time student pays approximately half, or less, the cost of tuition and fees charged at any other college in the state.

According to a recent survey given to exiting students, when graduates were asked, "Would you recommend CCRI to a friend or family member?" nearly 99 percent said yes. ATHLETICS AT CCRI

AN OVERVIEW OF CCRI ATHLETICS PAST AND PRESENT

The Community College of Rhode Island is home to one of the Ocean State's finest and most successful intercollegiate athletic programs.

Since its inception in 1965, CCRI has long been considered a front-runner in New England community college and junior college athletic circles. The basketball, baseball, tennis, volleyball, cross country, golf, and soccer teams have all been nationally ranked. The 2002 women's soccer team captured the school's first national championship, while a number of other squads, including men's basketball and women's soccer, were national runners-up.

With more than 5,500 victories, 222 All-Americans, I28 Region XXI championships, and 835 All-Region selections, CCRI leads the way among all New England community colleges.

Great coaching has been the key to CCRI's success. From the athletic department's humble beginnings in 1965, the school has always featured legendary coaches.

With Hall of Fame Athletic Director and men's basketball coach Vin Cullen; baseball coaches Ken Hopkins, Whitey Fell, and Art Pontarelli; tennis coach Ray Carr, and volleyball coach Gail Davis, the tradition of great coaches and top-flight teaching has extended through the years and continues to this day.

The college is also a member of the National Junior College Athletic Association and an associate member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. CCRI fields intercollegiate men's teams in baseball, basketball, and soccer, and intercollegiate women's teams in volleyball, basketball, soccer, and softball.

The Community College of Rhode Island has proven to be a stepping stone for many student athletes who have moved on to complete their academic and athletic careers at four-year colleges and universities throughout the nation.

2022-23 SEASON OUTLOOK

Coming off another Region XXI Championship and a trip to the NJCAA Division III National Tournament, CCRI begins a new era in 2022–23 under the guidance of first-year head coach **Marcus Douthit**, a former standout at Providence College who served as an assistant under ex-Knights coach Rick Harris.

Aside from learning the ropes as a full-time head coach, Douthit's first challenge will be replacing the production of Mitchel Noresca and Theo Jadotte, who are gone from this year's team; Noresca graduated after setting the school's all-time rebounding record and earning First Team NJCAA All-American honors while Jadotte – also a fierce rebounder who set the school's single-game rebounding record last season – transferred to UMass-Dartmouth.

The Knights will rely heavily on sophomore guards **Richard Pina** (Rumford, RI) and **Jason Palmer** (Westerly, RI) who are efficient ball-handlers and deadly shooters from the perimeter; Pina started 19 games last year on a team that finished 23-5 and averaged a solid 10.0 points per game while Palmer will be making his CCRI debut in 2022–23.

Also returning this year are sophomore guard **Tyler Lima** (Pawtucket, RI) and sophomore forward **Connor Warner** (Westerly, RI), both of whom were key reserves on last year's team but will move into more of a starter's role this year as the Knights rebuild with a relatively new roster. Sophomore guard **Neiko Ward** (East Providence, RI) will also fill up quality minutes on both sides of the ball.

Freshman guard **Robens Garcia** (Providence, RI) will slide into a reserve role at the start of the year and provide backcourt depth off the bench and the team will also lean on freshman forward **Bereket Janat** (Westerly, RI) a solid rebounder and rangy presence in the paint who can connect from close range.

With the Knights' reputation as one of the top programs in the northeast, Douthit will have a wealth of talent to choose from for 2022–23. The program has big shoes to fill heading into what should be another competitive season as CCRI attemps to defend its regional title.

COACHING STAFF



Marcus Douthit Head Coach

Marcus Douthit replaces Rick Harris as the Head Coach for the 2022–23 season.

He was selected by the Los Angeles Lakers in the second round (54th overall pick) in the 2004 NBA Draft. He ended up playing in Belgium in his first year as a professional. In his second year as a pro, he played in the NBA D-League for the Albuquerque Thunderbirds under head

coach Michael Cooper in the 2005-06 season, leading them to a league championship. He also played in several European countries, including Turkey and Russia.

In addition to playing in Europe, Douthit also played in Asia, where he had a stint in South Korea in 2006-07 for the Daegu Orions. In 2010, he returned to his native Philippines and played for the men's national team, Smart Gilas, where he earned the MVP award in the 2010 Champions Cup. A year later, he joined the Foshan Dralions in China before returning to the Philippines in 2015 to play for Blackwater Elite, winning the 2015 PBA Commissioners Cup. His last stop in Asia was in 2017, when he played for the Hanoi Buffaloes, a Vietnamese team that competes in the Thailand Basketball Super League.

At the college level, Douthit played under head coach Tim Welsh at Providence College and earned the team's Marvin Barnes Defensive Player Award in his junior and senior seasons. Douthit will use his experience as a collegiate and professional player and give insight to mold this year's young CCRI basketball squad. He earned his bachelor's degree in Social Science.

Douthit resides in Mansfield, MA.





Andy Jackson Assistant Coach/ Strength Coach

One of the more well-respected coaches at CCRI, **Andy Jackson** brings a wealth of knowledge both on and off

the court, having trained some of Rhode Island's top high school and college athletes through the years.

Among his most notable clients are former All-American running back Steve Silva of Holy Cross, former Boston College and Indianapolis Colts defensive back Jamie Silva, return specialist and former fourth-round NFL draft pick Will Blackmon of Boston College, former Stonehill College basketball team captain Soap Toun and former Bishop Hendrick and West Virginia basketball standout Joe Mazzulla.

In addition to his duties with the men's basketball team, Jackson trains CCRI athletes in various sports and is known for always going above and beyond the call of duty. As a result, he was named CCRI's Coach of the Year for the 2014-15 season.

Jackson competed actively in bodybuilding and held the titles of Mr. Eastern America, Mr. Boston and Mr. Rhode Island from 1970-72. In 1990, he finished fourth in the Mr. Rhode Island competition. Jackson graduated from Mt. Pleasant High School in 1970 and received a Technical Arts degree from Providence Opportunity Industrial Center in 1974.

Jackson has served as a mentor to area youth for more than 25 years with experience at the Olneyville Boys Club, Washington Park Community Center and John Hope Settlement House. He also coaches in the Providence Recreation Fall League.

Jackson currently lives in Providence.



Josh Perry Assistant Coach

Josh Perry returns to the CCRI men's basketball coaching staff for his fifth year after serving as a volunteer assistant during the 2014-15 season.

Perry played two seasons at CCRI from 2010 through 2012 as a backup guard, appearing in 42 games. Last year, Perry helped with statistical entry and aided with game reports for the team. His experience with community college athletics, in addition to his expertise as a player, make him a valued asset to the CCRI coaching staff.

Prior to college, Perry played basketball and ran track at South Kingstown High School.

2021–22 SEASON SUMMARY

Another banner year for the men's basketball program ended with a 23-5 record, another Region XXI championship, and a return trip to the NJCAA Division III Men's Basketball Tournament.

Led by rebounding record-setters Theonoah Jadotte and NJCAA First Team All-American Mitchel Noresca, the Knights won their second consecutive regional title as the tournament's No. I seed and earned the No. 3 seed at the NJCAAs, where they finished sixth overall.

The men's team, seeded third in this year's tournament, finished sixth overall following a close, 76-75, loss to top-seeded Riverland Community College in the consolation bracket. CCRI ended the season with a 23-5 record after winning its second consecutive Region XXI championship. In addition to the tournament appearance, the Knights won 20 games for the fourth time in the last five seasons and won 10 consecutive games heading into the national tournament, including their wins in the Region XXI

Region XXI Tournament hosted at the Warwick Field House.

Marcus Douthit, a former Providence College standout who joined CCRI in 2019–20 as an assistant, will begin the upcoming season as the men's interim head coach in place of Rick Harris, who parted ways with the college after 15 seasons. The Knights compete in Division III. Home games are played at the Knight Campus in Warwick.

In addition to his prowess on the boards, Noresca led the Knights with 20.1 points per game, followed by Jadotte at 14.2. The Knights also received quality play throughout the year from big man Levi King and freshman guard Richard "RJ" Pina, who averaged 10.0 points per game with 19 starts in 28 games.

As a team, CCRI ranked among the best in Division III in a number of categories; they finished third in field goal percentage, No. I in the nation in offensive rebounding, and fifth overall in opponents' field goal percentage, cementing their status as one of the country's top teams on bnoth sides of the ball.

2022-23 SEASON OUTLOOK

Coming off a remarkable season that featured the program's first trip to the NJCAA Division III National Tournament since 2013, head coach Doug Haynes and his Knights have high hopes for the 2022–23 season.

CCRI figures to be on the nation's top teams with a slew of returning players that includes sophomore center **Maggie Schwab** (North Kingstown, RI), sophomore guard **Michelle Moreno** (Providence, RI), sophomore guard **Chloe Rayko** (Coventry, RI), and sophomore guard **Elizabeth Bruno** (Providence, RI).

Schwab will be a force in the paint on both sides of the ball, whether it's controlling the pace through her rebounding prowess or scoring from close range to pace the Knights' offense. The sharp-shooting Rayko is dangerous from beyond the arc and could contest for the nation's No. I spot among three-point shooters — a dangerous weapon for CCRI if and when they trail in a game and need to mount a quick comeback.

Bruno and Moreno are a steady backcourt duo with plenty of postseason experience both at the regional and national level and will help dictate the pace of play for the Knights. The offense will run through them and they will be responsible for feeding the ball inside to Schwab or kicking it back out to Rayko. In the event others are unable to connect, Bruno and Moreno have enough offensive ability to carry the load on any given night.

With so much firepower offensively, the Knights will be tough to beat within their own region; they finished 9-0 against their regional rivals in 2021–22 and might be able to run the table again this season given their depth and experience.

Haynes has led a remarkable turanound in a short amount of time and will have the Knights disciplined, poised, and ready to play each night. A return trip to the National Tournament is a safe bet for this loaded roster in 2022–23.



Doug Haynes Head Coach

Hall of Fame alumnus **Doug Haynes** returns to CCRI's women's basketball program for his fifth year at the helm for the Lady Knights.

Taking over just prior to the start of the season, Haynes molded a team of young players – many of whom he did not recruit – and led them a 12-14 record in addition to an appearance in the Northeast District Championship.

Prior to taking over at CCRI, Haynes enjoyed an 18-year career as the head coach at St. Mary's Academy at Bay View. Haynes earned Rhode Island Division I Coach of the Year honors seven times at Bay View in addition to being named the 2014 National High School Federation Coach of the Year. He also won two state championships, five state runner-up titles and seven division championships.

At CCRI, Haynes starred as a two-sport athlete from 1987 through 1989, exceling in basketball and baseball. He was the men's basketball team MVP in 1988 and 1989 and was a two-time All-New England selection and an NJCAA All-American as a sophomore. He graduated as the fourth member of the school's 1,000-point club and, at the time, the third leading scorer in program history with 1,043 points.

On the baseball field, Haynes earned two All-New England selections as an outfielder and posted a .403 batting average to lead the Knights to a third-place finish in the 1988 NJCAA World Series. Haynes also attended the University of Rhode Island from 1984 through 87 before earning his associate degree at CCRI in 1989. He is employed in juvenile corrections at the Rhode Island Training School for Youth in Cranston and lives in North Kingstown.



Joel Tuoni Assistant Coach

Joel Tuoni returns to the Lady Knights for his fifth year as assistant coach.

Tuoni boasts 32 years of coaching experience in the Rhode Island Interscholastic League, including 28 as a varsity coach in basketball and softball, and was

a two-time Rhode Island Division I Coach of the Year award winner.

Tuoni also played at CCRI alongside Haynes and a was a co-captain on the 1988-89 team that won the New England and Northeast Regional Championships and appeared in the NJCAA Tournament.

Tuoni lives in South Kingstown, RI.



Victoria Wilkerson Assistant coach

Victoria Wilkerson returns to the Lady Knights coaching staff for her eighth season, her third as a full-time assistant after spending three years as a volunteer.

Wilkerson graduated from Pilgrim High School and attended both Southern Vermont College and Rhode Island College, studying in Liberal Arts and Psychology, respectively.

She currently works at The J. Arthur Trudeau Memorial Center and resides in Warwick.



Kat Raposo Assistant Coach

Kat Raposo joins the Knights' staff after a stellar career in which she earned NJCAA Division II Third Team All-American honors in 2019.

A two-sport star who also played soccer at CCRI, Raposo led the Knights

2021–22 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL SUMMARY

CCRI Hall of Famer and Class of 1989 alumnus Doug Haynes continues to make an impact as he enters his fourth year as head coach .

The 2021–22 season was his best yet as the Knights finished 17-7 overall, won the Region XXI championship as the tournament's No . I seed, and advanced to the NJCAA Division III Women's Basketball Tournament for the first time since 2013.

This was a remarkable turnaround considering CCRI won only six games prior to the canceled 2020-21 season. All five starters earned earn All-Region XXI honors, led by first-team selection Maggie Schwab. The 17 victories were also the Knights' most since the 2012–13 season.

As the tournament's 10th seed, the Knights ended their season on a high note by beating sixth-seeded Rock Valley College in the consolation round . Winning the Region XXI championship capped a remarkable turn- around for the women's program, which won just six games in 2019–20.

In 2021–22, the Knights were deadly from beyond the arc, ranking fifth in the nation in three-point field goal percentage. They also finished third defensively in field-goal percentage allowed, a true dual threat and one of the nation's most well-balanced teams.

The Knights compete in Division III. Home games are played at the Knight Campus in Warwick .


