ABOUT CCRI

The Community College of Rhode Island opened its doors in 1964 with 325 students in a temporary space on Promenade Street in Providence as Rhode Island Junior College. Today, with four campuses throughout the state, CCRI enrolls an average of more than 14,000 credit students each semester, making it the largest comprehensive community college in New England.

Forty percent of its students identify themselves as part of a minority group, many of whom are the first in their families to attend college. Accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, CCRI offers more than 100 degree and certificate programs in the arts, business, computer studies, engineering, health sciences, human services, liberal arts, and science departments taught by faculty who are experts in their field.

Each year, Rhode Islanders fill more than 40,000 seats in our professional development, skill enhancement, job retraining, and noncredit personal enrichment courses offered by CCRI's Division of Workforce Partnerships. CCRI students are active participants in campus life and in the community. The college offers a varsity athletic program with sports and a diverse selection of student clubs and organizations, including student government.

Annually, students, faculty and staff volunteer for a variety of Rhode Island non-profit organizations, making life better for those less fortunate. Since its inception, CCRI has graduated more than 68,000 students, with 95 percent of them living and working in Rhode Island. The college is the No. 1 provider of nurses and other health care workers in the state.

Additionally, more than 1,000 CCRI students per year transfer to Rhode Island College and the University of Rhode Island to continue their education. CCRI's tuition is the most affordable in Rhode Island. A full-time student pays approximately half, or less, the cost of tuition and fees charged at any other college in the state.

According to a recent survey given to exiting students, when graduates were asked, "Would you recommend CCRI to a friend or family member?" nearly 99 percent said yes. By preparing students to continue their education or to enter the state's work force, the Community College of Rhode Island provides its students with the opportunity to change their lives and achieve their dreams.

The CCRI Knight Campus is home to the Vincent A. Cullen Field House with four basketball courts, four tennis courts, three volleyball courts and a fully-equipped weight room. The men's and women's basketball teams play their home games on the center wood court. Athletic Department administration, coaches and staff have offices at this location.

The CCRI baseball team plays its home games at Harold "Whitey" Fell Field, named in honor of the college's former head baseball coach.

The Knight Campus has two additional outdoor fields for team practice and recreational use.



Flanagan Campus **1762 Louisquisset Pike, Lincoln**

The CCRI Flanagan Campus has a field house with four basketball courts, four tennis courts, four volleyball courts, a six-lane swimming pool, an indoor track, a modern dance studio and a fully-equipped weight room. The women's volleyball team plays its home matches in the Flanagan Campus Field House. Athletic Department administration, coaches and staff have offices at this location.

The Flanagan Campus has several outdoor fields for team practice and competition as well as recreational use. The cross country team and the men's and women's soccer teams host their home meets and matches at this site.



Additional sites

Some CCRI teams play their home games at nearby off-campus locations. The softball team plays its home games at Winslow Park Field in Warwick and the indoor and outdoor track teams travel to their opponent's site or a neutral site for matches.

AN OVERVIEW OF CCRI ATHLETICS PAST AND PRESENT

The Community College of Rhode Island is home to one of the Ocean State's finest and most successful intercollegiate athletic programs.

Since its inception in 1965, CCRI has long been considered a front-runner in New England community college and junior college athletic circles. The basketball, baseball, tennis, volleyball, cross country, golf, and soccer teams have all been nationally ranked. The 2002 women's soccer team captured the school's first national championship, while a number of other squads, including men's basketball and women's soccer, were national runners-up.

With more than 5,500 victories, 222 All-Americans, 128 Region XXI championships, and 835 All-Region selections, CCRI leads the way among all New England community colleges.

Great coaching has been the key to CCRI's success. From the athletic department's humble beginnings in 1965, the school has always featured legendary coaches. With Hall of Fame Athletic Director and men's basketball coach Vin Cullen; baseball coaches Ken Hopkins, Whitey Fell, and Art Pontarelli; tennis coach Ray Carr; and volleyball coach Gail Davis, the tradition of great coaches and top-flight teaching has extended through the years and continues to this day.

The college is also a member of the National Junior College Athletic Association and an associate member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. CCRI fields intercollegiate men's teams in baseball, basketball, soccer, cross country, indoor and outdoor track, and golf and intercollegiate women's teams in volleyball, basketball, cross country, indoor and outdoor track, soccer, and softball.

In addition to intercollegiate sports, CCRI offers four sports at the club level: men's volleyball, swimming, women's beach volleyball, and eSports. The Community College of Rhode Island has proven to be a stepping stone for many student athletes who have moved on to complete their academic and athletic careers at four-year colleges and universities throughout the nation.

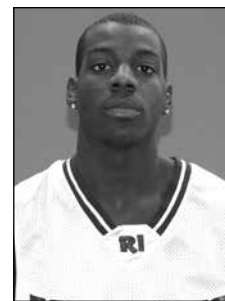

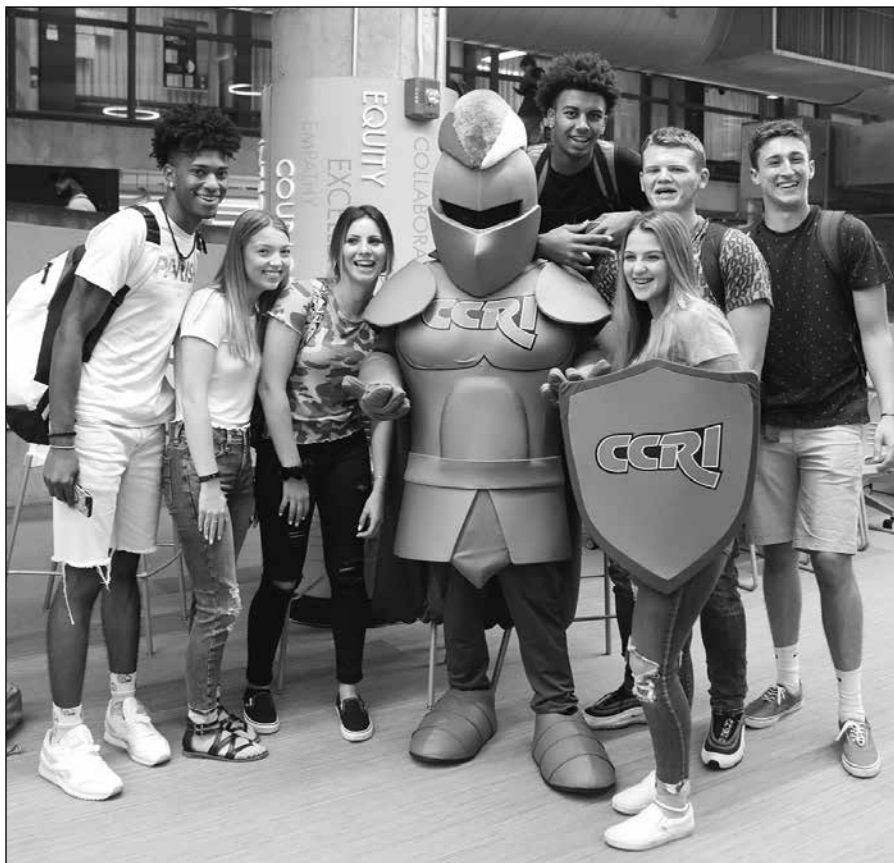

2022 SEASON OUTLOOK

The Knights will have many new and familiar faces in new positions in 2022. First-year head coach Joe Hopkins takes the helm after serving as an assistant for three years.

Hopkins has rebuilt the CCRI coaching staff with a couple of familiar faces, including former First Team All-Region XXI player Zach Odsen, who played for the Knights in 2019 when they earned a trip to the NJCAA Division III World Series,

and Jonathan Vazquez, another former All-Region XXI player who starred for the Knights in 2013. Rounding out the Knights coaching staff will be new addition Joe Brooks, who brings baseball experience from many levels, including AAU with the New England Scorpions, and at North Kingstown High School and Rhode Island College.

Not only will the Knights have an all-new coaching staff, but they will also have many new faces due to the fact there are only two returning players: Captain **James "Trey" Coleman** (Pawtucket, RI) and **Marion Offerman** (Central Falls, RI). Both are technically still freshman, though they appeared in Spring Training games during the COVID-shortened 2020 season. They will be solid contributors on a very young Knights' team while also providing leadership.

The Knights' pitching staff will have five main starters, but will use as many arms as it takes to battle through the arduous NJCAA Region XXI season. The staff will consist of **Matthew Winn** (Cranston, RI), **Garrett Bolwell** (Chepachet, RI), **Nate Campbell** (Johnston, RI), **Shaun Quirk** (Narragansett, RI), and **Livio Rodriguez** (Providence, RI). All five should have plenty of opportunities to prove their worth on the field for the Knights this season as they battle a tough schedule both in Region XXI and throughout the northeast.

Offensively, the Knights will be led by Coleman, who will bat in the heart of the lineup; his speed and power combo will be a formidable asset for CCRI this season. Transfer **Tyler Monahan** (Woonsocket, RI) will be another key component in the offense, providing power and run production. **Caleb Harris** (Cranston, RI) is another hot bat out of Cranston that should hit near the top of the lineup and will look to set the table for the power hitters in the middle of the lineup. **Rafael Rodriguez** (Providence, RI) and **Geuris Vargas** (Cranston, RI) will provide depth to an already-potent lineup while **Carlos Molines** (Montreal, Canada) is another intriguing bat from north of the border that will fortify the CCRI offense.

The Knights are going to be an offense-first team that will look to rack up the runs and provide enough pitching to get the victory. One thing is for sure: Their games will be extremely exciting for fans to watch.

DID YOU KNOW?

Former Major League Baseball pitcher Rheal Cormier '88 is the only CCRI alumnus with his number retired. Cormier wore No. 20, which was officially retired in 2012.

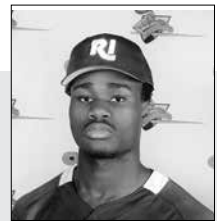

COACHING STAFF

Joe Hopkins '81 Head Coach



Hopkins, a CCRI alumnus, takes over the baseball program for his first season as head coach after being elevated from assistant coach during the pandemic in 2021.

Hopkins played for the Knights from 1979–81 and spent three years as an assistant prior to the pandemic. As a catcher during his playing days, Hopkins earned First and Second Team All-Region honors.

He also brings a wealth of coaching experience to his new position in both basketball and baseball, having coached basketball in the

George Donnelly Sunset League in Newport from 2012–16 and serving as the head basketball coach for Western Hills Middle School and the Cranston High School West freshman boys' team.

Hopkins was a patrolman for the Cranston Police Department from 1997–2009 before his promotion to detective, a position he still holds today. Before joining the Cranston Police Department, he owned JMH Painting Company from 1987–97. Hopkins also graduated Roger Williams University with a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice and also holds associate degrees in Criminal Justice and Liberal Arts from CCRI. He is a member of the Johnston High School Athletics Hall of Fame. Hopkins resides in Cranston, RI.

Jonathan Vazquez Assistant Coach

Vazquez joins the Knights for his first season as an assistant coach after playing at CCRI from 2013–14.

Vazquez will serve as the first base coach. In 2013, he earned All-Region XXI honors as a first baseman, batting .382 with eight doubles, 16 runs scored, 10 RBIs, and 15 walks, which raised his on-base percentage to .484.

Vazquez transferred to URI, where he graduated in the Fall of 2016 with his Bachelor of Arts in Psychology, and earned his Juris Doctor degree from Roger Williams University School of Law in 2020. Vazquez resides in Johnston, RI.

Joseph Brooks Assistant Coach



Brooks joins the CCRI baseball coaching staff for his first year, where he will serve as the team's pitching coach.

Since 2016, Brooks has served as the New England Scorpions Baseball Club Director of Player Development. Prior to that, he was an assistant baseball coach at LaSalle Academy in 2019 and North Kingstown High School in 2018.

He is an alumnus of Rhode Island College, where he played on the baseball team for four years, winning a Little East Championship in 2011 and serving as a team captain in 2015. Brooks resides in Pawtucket, RI, and works at Wannamoisett Country Club as the Assistant Golf Pro.

Zachary Odsen Assistant Coach



Zachary Odsen returns to CCRI, where he started his college baseball career in 2018, for his first season as an assistant coach.

Odsen will serve as the team's third base coach and primary statistician. As a player, Odsen was a member of the Knights' 2018 team that advanced to the NJCAA Division III World Series in Greeneville, TN, a year in which he also earned All-Region XXI baseball honors as a second baseman. That season, he hit

.305 with eight doubles, two home runs, a .453 slugging percent, and 23 RBIs.

After CCRI, Odsen played at Tusculum University in Greeneville, TN. He resides in Cranston, RI.

SEASON SUMMARY

The Knights reached new heights in 2019, finishing 27-12 overall and earning a trip to the NJCAA Division III College World Series for the first time since 2012.

Their 27-12 finish included a 16-1 record in Region XXI play and an incredible hot streak in which they won 22 of 24 games from mid-March through May.

Leading the charge offensively last year was leadoff hitter and freshman **Anthony Ramos (Cranston, RI)**, who batted .416, good enough for 50th in the nation, and held an impressive .549 on-base percentage, which ranked 14th among NJCAA D-III qualifying batters. Alongside Ramos was freshman **Alex Martinez (Cranston, RI)**, who batted .400 with a .500 on-base percentage. Martinez also drove in 25 runs and scored 23 times in 32 games.

Sophomore co-captain **Nick D'Ambra (Coventry, RI)** had a fantastic second year as part of the Knights' resurgence with a .398 batting average, ranking him 11th in Region XXXI, and 32 RBIs, which was second on the team.

The pitching staff was terrific in 2019, highlighted by freshman **Ben Sears (East Providence, RI)**, who won eight of his 11 appearances – 13th in the nation and No. 1 in the region. Sears pitched a team-high 67 2/3 innings with 99 strikeouts, which ranked sixth in the country, and averaged a whopping 13.17 strikeouts per nine innings. Ramos and Sears also received NJCAA Second and Third Team All-American Honors, respectively.

Sophomore **Zack D'Andrea (Warwick, RI)**, made 10 appearances for CCRI and CJ Woods (East Providence, RI) made eight appearances with six victories and pitched 47 1/3 innings, second most on the team behind Sears.

The Knights got off to a slow start in 2019, finishing their Florida trip with a 3-7 record, but got hot in March. They won 11 in a row toward the end of the season and earned a spot in the College World Series with a win over Suffolk County in the District F championship game. The Knights were heavily represented among the Region XXI awards with Martinez, D'Ambra, Ramos, Woods, Sears, **Joey Barter (Coventry, RI)**, **Zack Odsen (Providence, RI)**, **Jacob Frost (Cranston, RI)**, **Ray Aponte (East Providence, RI)** and **David Meech (Douglas, MA)** earning All-Region honors. Head coach Kevin Rix was named Region XXI Coach of the Year in only his second year with the Knights.

2022 SEASON OUTLOOK

The 2022 Knights will rely heavily on their offense in lieu of the typical 1-0 or 2-0 fastpitch scores fans are used to seeing. CCRI has plenty of firepower up and down the starting lineup and in reserve roles. First-year head coach Paul Mercier takes the helm for the Knights after serving as an assistant for one – albeit shortened – season due to the pandemic. Mercier will be assisted by Bob Sasso, who brings nearly 20 years of coaching experience to the program as CCRI looks to forge a new path and write a new chapter to its history as it moves to Division III after spending the last 20 years at the D-II level.

The Knights are led by their Co-Captains: **Casey Regine** (Cranston, RI) and **Emily**

McNeil (West Warwick, RI). Both appeared in the seven spring training games in 2020 before the season was cut short due to the pandemic. Regine will play the keystone in the Lady Knights infield while McNeil will serve at shortstop. Both should provide great defense up the middle while also serving as key cogs in the potent CCRI lineup. Both are sophomores academically but are technically freshmen athletically due to the COVID season and will look to provide leadership to a very young team.

Joining the two captains are a bumper crop of very talented outfielders.

Hanna Dias (Charlestown, RI) will bat toward the top of the lineup and play centerfield. Dias has great speed, which will benefit her in the field as well as on the bases. She will be joined in the outfield by **Emily Gil** (West Warwick, RI), another athletic outfielder who will serve as the team's leadoff hitter from the left side of the plate. Between Gil and Dias, not many balls will drop in for hits and they will surly amass their share of web gems. **Abby Pinault**

(Pawtucket, RI), **Kate Ferns** (Warwick, RI), **Courtney Hafey** (Somerset, MA), and **Savannah Pastore** (Hope, RI) should also get plenty of time in the outfield as the team tries to find the hot bat for each pitching matchup they face.

The Knights also have some very talented infielders as well, including **Jillian Serra** (Pawtucket, RI), who will provide a power bat in the heart of the lineup and play third base with the occasional start in the pitcher's circle. **Samantha Marsella** (Rehoboth, MA) is another infielder and pitcher that will get plenty of at-bats in the heart of the lineup in addition to her role on the pitching staff. **Ashley Torres** (Pawtucket, RI) will serve as the team's primary catcher and provide another power bat. Torres will be counted on a great deal to provide electricity in the lineup. Ferns will play first base and provide another left-handed bat in the lineup. **Ryleigh Ruddock** (Warwick, RI) will be a key element on the pitching staff and will get many opportunities in the circle this year to prove what she can do for the Knights.

CCRI has a tough schedule, but also has the firepower to survive and improve with every game. One thing is certain: The Knights squad will provide plenty of excitement this year for their loyal fans.

DID YOU KNOW?

The most prolific hitter in program history is Ashley Olson '12, who holds the school records for most hits in a season (62), most career hits (113), most career triples (8), most RBI in a season (62) and most career RBI (99). Olson went on to play for the University of Rhode Island.

Former pitcher Courtney Sheridan '17 owns all of CCRI's strikeout records, including career strikeouts (220), strikeouts in a season (148) and the school's single-game strikeout record (16).

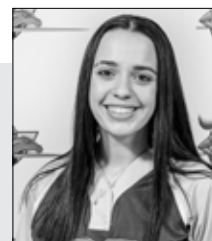

COACHING STAFF

Paul Mercier Head Coach



Paul Mercier enters his first season as head coach for the Lady Knights after spending time as an assistant under former coach Kim Warrington.

Mercier coached CCRI during the Fall Ball season and on the Lady Knights' annual trip to Florida before the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the entire 2020 season. This past summer, Mercier was elevated to head coach, bringing with him 20 years of youth coaching experience.

Most recently, Mercier coached the North Smithfield High School Northmen, leading the program to an overall record of 74-26 during his tenure with 10 postseason appearances, including two division titles. Mercier coached the team during its transition to Division I in the Rhode Island Interscholastic League (RIIL) and posted high win percentages during his time with North Smithfield, earning high praise and respect within the RIIL community. In 2017, Mercier earned RIIL Division II Coach of the Year honors after leading the Northmen to the Division II Title.

From 2005–2017, Mercier also coached at two different age levels for the Blackstone Valley Blazers Travel Softball Program, spending six years at the helm with the 16U and 18U groups followed by five years as the coach of the U23 college program.

Prior to his coaching tenure with the Blackstone Valley Blazers, Mercier served as the President of the North Smithfield Little League Program from 2000–2004, where he was in charge of both the youth baseball and youth softball operations. In addition to winning multiple championships with both programs, Mercier also helped remodel the ballfield complex.

Mercier has also served as a volunteer for the Rhode Island Special Olympics as a traffic helper, where he guided traffic and helped prepare food for the athletes.

Mercier is a graduate of Woonsocket High School, where he was on the student council and was a four-year letterman in golf. He has enjoyed playing slow pitch softball for more than 20 years. Mercier owns PM Colors, Inc., a Jewelry Manufacturing company in Johnston, RI, and oversees management and operates factory production. He resides in North Smithfield, RI.

Robert Sasso Assistant Coach



Sasso, a CCRI alumnus, joins the Lady Knights for his first year as an assistant coach. His main roles include serving as the team's hitting and defensive skills coach while also handling all aspects of recruiting incoming freshmen.

Sasso boasts 23 years of successful coaching experience at many levels

with both boys and girls and has also held many other administrative roles in various youth sports organizations, including, but not limited to, president of the Rhode Island Fire N' Ice Fastpitch Softball travel program, where he was responsible for overseeing the budget and dealing with other organizations and communities in the greater New England area.

As a coach, Sasso has been successful at every level; he coached varsity baseball at William M. Davies, Jr. Career and Technical High School in Lincoln, RI, and also coached two high school softball at Scituate and Smithfield High Schools. In addition, Sasso has coached three different age groups to state championships in travel softball: U14, U16, and U18. During that timeframe, Sasso compiled a record of 178-47 at the travel level. Working with the U18 travel teams also helped Sasso assist players with all aspects of the college recruiting process.

Sasso graduated from Davies in 1991, where he was a four-year letterman in baseball as the team's starting catcher, earning Second Team All Division honors twice. He played baseball at CCRI from 1992–1993 and graduated with an associate degree in Law Enforcement.

SEASON SUMMARY

In their last season prior to the pandemic, the 2019 CCRI softball team finished 11-11 under then third-year head coach Kim Warrington. While they did not qualify for the postseason due to their record against NJCAA competition, the Knights provided many signature moments throughout the season.

The 2019 campaign started slowly as the Knights opened 2-6, but quickly ran off eight consecutive wins. The Knights ended 2019 on a high note, defeating Central Maine 12-4 to finish with 11 victories.

Offensively, the Knights were led by **Mackenzie Doyle** (Glocester, RI) who led the nation with a .635 batting average and .689 on-base percentage. She finished the season with a team-high 47 hits, which included 10 doubles and a home run. Doyle also drove in 18 runs and led CCRI with 32 runs scored. **Hannah Northup** (Warwick, RI) was another effective bat for CCRI, hitting .423 with 30 hits, 22 RBI and 21 runs scored. **Alexis LeBelle** (Warwick, RI) played excellent defensively at third base while also providing power in the middle of the lineup; she batted .400 with 26 hits, including nine doubles, a triple and three home runs with 21 RBI and 21 runs scored.

Two sophomores who were big contributors included team MVP and Co-Captain **Hannah Caliri** (Pawtucket, RI), who batted .349 with 22 hits, including eight doubles and three home runs, while adding a team-leading 26 RBI and 17 runs scored. Co-Captain **Maddie McDonald** (East Providence, RI) was another key hitter, batting .410 with 25 hits, including seven doubles and a triple with 11 RBI and 17 runs scored. **Raevyn Watson** (East Providence, RI) was the final impact bat for the Knights, batting .326 with 15 hits, 10 runs scored and six RBI.

On the mound, two main arms pitched most of the innings for CCRI. Caliri led the Knights with a 6-5 record, pitching 62.2 innings with 100 strikeouts and a team-leading 2.81 ERA. Caliri was ranked No. 3 in the NJCAA with 11.25 strikeouts per game. The second pitcher was freshman **Dayna Jackvony** (Cumberland, RI), who pitched 53.0 innings with 25 strikeouts and four victories. Both performed well against many potent lineups throughout the course of the season.

Gregg Cornell '84 Head Coach

CCRI alumnus **Gregg Cornell**, the school's longest-tenured coach, enters his 33rd season as the cross country and outdoor track and field coach and his 19th as the indoor track coach since the latter program began in 2002. His drive, knowledge and teaching skills have combined to produce several standout athletes at the

college.

During his career, Cornell has coached 12 NJCAA Division III All-Americans and more than 25 All-District runners. The men's team has placed in the top three at the Northeast District Meet five times and in the top 10 at the NJCAA Division III National Championship three times.

Cornell has been a runner for more than 30 years. As a student at CCRI, he was the college's first All-New England cross country runner in 1982 and was named to the All-New England team for two consecutive seasons. Cornell was a member of CCRI's first two New England title teams and was voted CCRI Athlete of the Year in the 1983-84 season. He is still recognized as one of the best runners in the college's history.

Cornell continued his running career at Bridgewater State University, where he earned Division III All-American honors in 1986 and was named Bridgewater State's Athlete of the Year in the 1986-87 season. His success carried over to marathons, and he became one of the state's best long-distance runners by winning the Cape Cod Marathon in 1995 and the Ocean State Marathon in 1991.

The college presented Cornell with the Distinguished Alumnus Award during the Rhode Island Legislative Scholar-Athlete Awards ceremony at the State House in April of 2010. He previously received special recognition in 1989 when he was inducted into the CCRI Athletic Hall of Fame.

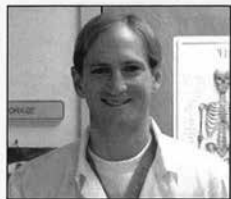

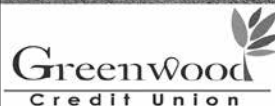
