### **ABOUT CCRI**

The Community College of Rhode Island opened its doors in 1964 with 325 students in a temporary space on Promenade Street in Providence as Rhode Island Junior College. Today, with four campuses throughout the state, CCRI enrolls an average of more than 14,000 credit students each semester, making it the largest comprehensive community college in New England.

Forty percent of its students identify themselves as part of a minority group, many of whom are the first in their families to attend college. Accredited by the New England Associ-

ation of Schools and Colleges, CCRI offers more than 100 degree and certificate programs in the arts, business, computer studies, engineering, health sciences, human services, liberal arts, and science departments taught by faculty who are experts in their field.

Each year, Rhode Islanders fill more than 40,000 seats in our professional development, skill enhancement, job retraining, and noncredit personal enrichment courses offered by CCRI's Division of Workforce Partnerships. CCRI students are active participants in campus life and in the community. The college offers a varsity athletic program with sports and a diverse selection of student clubs and organizations, including student government.

Annually, students, faculty and staff volunteer for a variety of Rhode Island non-profit organizations, making life better for those less fortunate. Since its inception, CCRI has graduated more than 68,000 students, with 95 percent of them living and working in Rhode Island. The college is the No. I provider of nurses and other health care workers in the state.

Additionally, more than I,000 CCRI students per year transfer to Rhode Island College and the University of Rhode Island to continue their education. CCRI's tuition is the most affordable in Rhode Island. A full-time student pays approximately half, or less, the cost of tuition and fees charged at any other college in the state.

According to a recent survey given to exiting students, when graduates were asked, "Would you recommend CCRI to a friend or family member?" nearly 99 percent said yes. By preparing students to continue their education or to enter the state's work force, the Community College of Rhode Island provides its students with the opportunity to change their lives and achieve their dreams.

### 2021–22 NJCAA ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM

### ATHLETICS AT CCRI

### AN OVERVIEW OF CCRI ATHLETICS **PAST AND PRESENT**

The Community College of Rhode Island is home to one of the Ocean State's finest and most successful intercollegiate athletic programs.

Since its inception in 1965, CCRI has long been considered a front-runner in New England community college and junior college athletic circles. The basketball, baseball, tennis, volleyball, cross country, golf, and soccer teams have all been nationally ranked. The 2002 women's soccer team captured the school's first national championship, while a number of other squads, including men's basketball and women's soccer, were national runners-up.

With more than 5,500 victories, 222 All-Americans, 128 Region XXI championships, and 835 All-Region selections, CCRI leads the way among all New England community colleges.

Great coaching has been the key to CCRI's success. From the athletic department's humble beginnings in 1965, the school has always featured legendary coaches.

With Hall of Fame Athletic Director and men's basketball coach Vin Cullen; baseball coaches Ken Hopkins, Whitey Fell, and Art Pontarelli; tennis coach Ray Carr, and volleyball coach Gail Davis, the tradition of great coaches and top-flight teaching has extended through the years and continues to this day.

The college is also a member of the National Junior College Athletic Association and an associate member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. CCRI fields intercollegiate men's teams in baseball, basketball, and soccer, and intercollegiate women's teams in volleyball, basketball, soccer, and softball.

The Community College of Rhode Island has proven to be a stepping stone for many student athletes who have moved on to complete their academic and athletic careers at four-year colleges and universities throughout the nation.

### **SEASON OUTLOOK**

Head coach Gabe Toro enters his 12th season at the helm of CCRI's men's soccer team with a deep roster that features nine returning players from a team that came within one win of a Region XXI championship a year ago in addition to transfers who could make an immediate impact in 2022.


Led by sophomore co-captains Wilson Penafiel (Providence, RI) and Pablo Puac (Pawtucket, RI) and the addition of freshman captain Cristian Munoz (Pawtucket, RI), the Knights expect to contend for another regional championship, which would be their first since 2001, and earn a shot at the college's first trip to the NJCAA Division III National Tournament, which will be held this year at Genesee Community College in upstate New York.

Aside from Munoz, the biggest additions to the 2022 roster are sophmore twin brothers **Roy Barrios** and **Juan Barrios**, both from Pawtucket, who played at Rhode Island College in 2021 and led Tolman High School to a state title in 2018. The two are dynamic scorers and passers and figure to rank among the best in the region in total points in 2022, which gives the Knights an immediate leg up on the competition in their quest for a championship.

"We have a good core of kids coming back, including most of our solid defenders and midfielders," Toro said. "The kids that did come in last season were among the most talented bunch we've had in a while and they really stepped up."

The biggest adjustment might be the loss of goalkeeper Eddie Tavares, who was the only sophomore on last year's team. Freshman **Brady Linfield** (Burrillville, RI) and **Lucas Petrarca** (Coventry, RI) will split time in net this year for CCRI with Linfield figuring to get the bulk of the work. Toro also expects major contributions from freshman forward **Joel Rosario** (Providence, RI), freshman midfielder **Andrez Maldonado** (Central Falls, RI), and freshman forward **Nathan Nascimento** (North Providence, RI), all of whom figure to add more firepower to the Knights' offense.

Given the success of last year's team, which started out hot and eventually advanced to the regional championship, where it lost I-0 to rival Bunker Hill, the 2022 Knights have high hopes with the expectation of making a run at a title before the year is through.

### Gabriel Toro Head Coach



**Gabriel Toro** returns for his 12th season as head coach of the CCRI men's soccer program.

He previously served as assistant coach of the program for two years under Victor Gaspar. Toro, a native of Colombia and a 1999 graduate of the University of Rhode Island, strives to continue the program's winning tradition. In addition to his coaching experience at CCRI, Toro has organized and coached clinics in Rhode Island and Massachusetts for boys and girls of all ages, with a focus on eliminating technical weaknesses and enhancing

players' strengths to improve their confidence and technical skills. In 2001, he led the Tolman High School boys' soccer team to a second-place finish in the state tournament. Toro has extensive playing experience with the semi-pro Lusitana Portuguese Club in Cumberland and the Providence Soccer League.

After graduating from URI with a bachelor's degree in psychology, he played three seasons for the Rhode Island Stingrays. At URI, he was a member of the No. 3-ranked men's team that garnered a record of 19-1-3 and won Atlantic-10 championship titles in 1995 and 1996. He was honored with the Bob Butler Sportsmanship Award in 1998.

### Mike Jerue Assistant Coach



Mike Jerue returns for his 12th year as assistant coach and his ninth with coach Toro's staff; he was previously the assistant to former men's soccer coach Victor Gaspar. Jerue played at CCRI in 1999 and is a former Region XXI championship goalkeeper.

A former teammate of

Toro's with the Lusitana Portuguese Club, Jerue has extensive training and knowledge playing both semi-pro and professional soccer. He has more than 30 years of experience with goalkeepers, which is his main focus on the coaching staff. He is also the co-founder of the MK Goalkeeping Academy in West Warwick. Jerue has coached at many levels, ranging from youth to high school to college. He recently began his third year as a coach for the North American Soccer League's Rhode Island Reds FC.

### Rafal Murawski Assistant Coach



**Rafal Murawski** returns for his fourth year as an assistant coach for the CCRI men's soccer program.

A longtime professional standout in Poland and England, Murawski began playing at 5 years old. His talent was evident at a young age by his peers in

Lezajsk, Poland, and he was soon drafted onto the town's competitive youth teams at the age of 9. He eventually rose through the ranks and competed on a number of all-star teams in Poland between the ages of 13 and 16.

By the time Murawski was a young teenager, he was fully dedicated to developing his soccer career; he moved away from his family to complete his high school education at a soccer school in Krakow, Poland, where he was coached by professionals and learned unique special training techniques. After completing soccer school, Murawski played at the semi-professional and professional level for nine years on third- and fourth-division teams in Poland and England. His soccer career lasted more than two decades and ended in 2015 following a series of injuries.





### SEASON OUTLOOK

The Knights are locked and loaded as they aim for their second consecutive NJCAA Region XXI Championship under the guidance of head coach Patrick Chin.

Last year's team won its first regional title since 2016 and returns a solid group of sophomores in addition to several key newcomers who figure to pay immediate dividends.

Sophomore co-captains **Madison Capwell** (Coventry, RI) and **Kelsey Conway** (Coventry, RI) return from a team that finished 7-4 last year and beat Massasoit to capture the college's first regional title since 2016. The Knights also came within one victory of a trip to the NJCAA Division III Women's Volleyball National Tournament.

Last year as a freshman, Capwell led the team with 98 kills and Conway contributed 40 kills in addition to playing the role of the team's No. I setter, a role she will resume as one of three sophomores on the 2022 team.

Eight freshmen join this year's team, all of whom figure to play a key role as the Knights attempt to win their second consecutive regional title. **Kaylee Crowley** (West Warwick, RI) and **Jadyn Jimmis-Brown** (West Warwick, RI) will play key roles on the right side while newcomers **Adriana Ortiz** (Providence, RI) and **Nicole Santos** (Pawtucket, RI) serve as defensive specialists. The secret weapon up front could be freshman **Madison Dessert** (Coventry, RI), a talented outside hitter who played alongside Conway and Capwell in high school and brings a new level of poise and talent to the roster.

The team's key to success is the steady guidance of Chin. Despite an entirely new roster stemming from the pandemic layover, Chin's team posted its second consecutive winning season in 2021.

Overall, the Knights have finished with a winning record five times in the last six years dating back to 2015. With this new influx of talent along with the tutelage of Chin, the Knights are primed for postseason success.

The 2022 season could see a repeat performance in the regional championship and perhaps another shot at a berth in the NJCAA Tournament.

### **2022 SEASON OUTLOOK**

After the last two seasons were canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the storied Knights' women's soccer program is starting fresh this year with an entirely new roster and new coaching.

The first major change was the hiring of new head coach Jeff Patten, the fourth coach in the program's history. As CCRI celebrates the 20th anniversary of its 2002 NJCAA National Championship team, Patten promises to bring new energy to a program that struggled in the years prior to the pandemic.

"I'm excited for this opportunity," said Patten, who coached for five seasons at coached five seasons at Dean College in Franklin, MA, from 2013–2017 prior to joining CCRI. "When I was at Dean, we used to play against CCRI, and they always had a really good program. That's the goal here – I want to bring it back to where it was.

"The pandemic changed a lot of people's lives. Dealing with the aftermath and getting people to trust again – whether it's trusting themselves, their coaches, or their teammates – is going to be the key to rebuilding."

Patten enters 2022 with a roster made up entirely of freshmen, led by captain **Catherine Beazley** (Kingston, RI), a defender who has the ability to anchor the back line in addition to controlling the team's pace on both ends of the field. The poised Beazley will be complemented on the other end of the field by scorers **Kelsey McKenna** (West Greenwich, RI) and **Jania Bliss** (Providence, RI), who are among the more lethal strikers on the roster.

With goalkeeper **Bailey Patton** (Charlestown, RI) in net, the Knights also figure to be stellar defensively.

Other programs in the region face similar uphill battles as colleges continue to battle back from the pandemic, so the Knights won't be alone in their quest to rebuild this program and reestablish the level success enjoyed for many decades under previous coaching regimes.

The emphasis in 2022 will be on progress and growth, especially with a roster not familiar with playing together at any level; it's an exciting time to be a Knight.


