

### ATHLETICS AT CCRI

## AN OVERVIEW OF CCRI ATHLETICS PAST AND PRESENT

The Community College of Rhode Island is home to one of the Ocean State's finest and most successful intercollegiate athletic programs.


Since its inception in 1965, CCRI has long been considered a front-runner in New England community college and junior college athletic circles. The basketball, baseball, tennis, volleyball, cross country, golf, and soccer teams have all been nationally ranked. The 2002 women's soccer team captured the school's first national championship, while a number of other squads, including men's basketball and women's soccer, were national runners-up.

With more than 5,500 victories, 222 All-Americans, I28 Region XXI championships, and 835 All-Region selections, CCRI leads the way among all New England community colleges.

Great coaching has been the key to CCRI's success. From the athletic department's humble beginnings in 1965, the school has always featured legendary coaches. With Hall of Fame Athletic Director and men's basketball coach Vin Cullen; baseball coaches Ken Hopkins, Whitey Fell, and Art Pontarelli; tennis coach Ray Carr, and volleyball coach Gail Davis, the tradition of great coaches and top-flight teaching has extended through the years and continues to this day.

The college is also a member of the National Junior College Athletic Association and an associate member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association. CCRI fields intercollegiate men's teams in baseball, basketball, soccer, cross country, indoor and outdoor track, and golf and intercollegiate women's teams in volleyball, basketball, cross country, indoor and outdoor track, soccer, and softball.

In addition to intercollegiate sports, CCRI offers four sports at the club level: men's volleyball, swimming, women's beach volleyball, and eSports. The Community College of Rhode Island has proven to be a stepping stone for many student athletes who have moved on to complete their academic and athletic careers at four-year colleges and universities throughout the nation.



## RI MEN'S BASKETBALL

#### **SEASON OUTLOOK**

The last time the Knights took the court, they were putting the finishing touches on an excellent 23-12 season that earned them

a trip to the NJCAA Men's Division III Basketball Tournament in Rochester, MN.

Shortly after the 2019-20 season ended, the COVID-19 pandemic put the world on hold, canceling athletics at the professional and collegiate levels for the next year and a half. As a result, the Knights didn't play a single game during the 2020-21 academic year, but will finally return to the court this season with several strong returnees and high hopes for another tournament run. Leading the way for the Knights for the 2021-22 season will be co-captains Mitchel Noresca (East Providence, RI) and Luke Fusaro (Charlestown, RI). Noresca produced a fantastic freshman year for the Knights in 2019-20 as he took the "big man" role in stride. He earned the nickname "Chairman of the Boards" due to his prowess in the paint, ripping down a staggering 523 rebounds, which not only led the region, but also topped the nation and smashed the previous CCRI program record of 388 rebounds set by Walt "Stretch" Edwards during the 1972-73 season. Fusaro played in 19 games for the Knights during their run to the D-III Tournament and only averaged a handful of points per game, but showed he had the prowess and accura-

cy to score from beyond the three-point arc,

where he shot an impressive 47.5%.

Joining the roster this year is 6-foot-5 forward/center **Levi King** (Westerly, RI), who can do more than just play in the frontcourt. King has a smooth shot and operates well in transition up and down the court. He comes to CCRI from Chariho High School, where he earned Second Team All-State honors after averaging 24.1 points and nearly 12 rebounds per game. **Nelvin Blanco** (Cranston, RI) from Cranston East High School is a

talented point guard who earned Second Team All-State honors in 2019 and will look to be one of the primary ball-handlers for the Knights. **Richard "RJ" Pina** (East Providence, RI) is another talented guard who earned Second Team Coaches Association All State honors in 2020 and will be called on to spell Blanco at the point guard position. Both Blanco and Pina can distribute the ball well and, when needed, create shots for themselves. Yet another point guard that will look to distribute the ball for the Knights is First Team All-Division selection **Jared Downing** (Woonsocket, RI).

Michael Resnick (Gloucester, RI), 6-4 forward from Ponaganset High School, offers size and athleticism in the frontcourt for the Knights. He's also very athletic, can step back and shoot jumpers, and provide a rebounding edge while always giving maximum effort on the floor. Theo Jadotte (Providence, RI) is another big man that will provide a low-post presence both on offense and defense. With tremendous athleticism, he will look to refine his inside game and develop a presence as an invaluable tone-setter who can block a shot, rip down a board, or throw down a monster jam. Another key addition for the Knights is Michael Harris (Cranston, RI), the son of head coach Rick Harris, who has an intimate knowledge of the Knights' style on the court. Harris, who can play both guard and forward, has seen the Knights at their best and is an intelligent player who will help the team run more efficiently.

#### **COACHING STAFF**



#### Rick Harris Head Coach

**Rick Harris** begins his 14th season at the helm of the Knights men's basketball program. He is just the third head coach in school history.

CCRI has compiled a 278-167 overall record and 169-42 record in Region XXI play. Those victories include six Region XXI championships and two Northeast District championships, which led to two appearances in the NJCAA Division II Men's Basketball National Tournament in Danville, IL, in 2007 and 2012.

The 2011-12 Knights finished 31-5, setting a new school record for wins by a CCRI basketball team. In addition, the 2011-12 Knights advanced to the D-II National Championship game for the second time in school history and the first time since 1991, when Hall of Fame head coach Vin Cullen led them to the finals. Most recently, Harris led the 2018-19 Knights to 28-4 record, which included an 18 game winning streak entering the Region XXI championship game.

Harris came to CCRI with more than two decades of experience coaching high school basketball. He made his mark on the Rhode Island scene as the varsity boys' basketball coach at Cranston East High School from 1990 to 2006, compiling 230 wins. Under his direction, the team won three consecutive RIIL Division IA State Championships in 2002, 2003 and 2004, and was the state finalist runner-up in 2001. The team also won four RIIL Division I League Championships in 1997, 2000, 2003 and 2004. Harris was chosen as the Rhode Island Basketball Coaches Association (RIBCA) Coach of the Year in 1996, 1997, 2002, 2003 and 2004.

Last spring, RIBCA inducted Harris into its Hall of Fame for his accomplishments and service to Rhode Island high school basketball.

Prior to coaching at Cranston East, Harris coached with Joe Hassett Sr. at Our

Lady of Providence and Jim Hopkins at both Cranston High School East and Johnston High School. He began his coaching career with the Catholic Youth Organization at St. Matthew.

Harris also served as treasurer of the RIBCA for 10 years and worked for the Los Angeles Lakers at their annual summer camp held in Santa Barbara, CA, and in Los Angeles as a camp coach and camp director from 2000 through 2015. Harris also directed the Rick Harris Hoops Skills Basketball Camp and currently is the director of the CCRI Summer Basketball School. Harris earned degrees from CCRI, Rhode Island College and Providence College. In addition to his duties at CCRI, he serves as a special education teacher in the Cranston School Department.

Harris was born in Providence and resides in Cranston with his wife, Lucy, and their two children, Michael and

## Marcus Douthit Assistant Coach

Marcus Douthit joins the CCRI coaching staff for his first season following 14 years of playing professionally.

He was selected by the Los Angeles Lakers in the second round (54th overall pick) in the 2004 NBA

Draft. He ended up playing in Belgium in his first year as a professional. In his second year as a pro, he played in the NBA D-League for the Albuquerque Thunderbirds under head coach Michael Cooper in the 2005-06 season, leading them to a league championship. He also played in several European countries, including Turkey and Russia.

In addition to playing in Europe, Douthit also played in Asia, where he had a stint in South Korea in 2006-07 for the Daegu Orions. In 2010, he returned to his native Philippines and played for the men's national team, Smart Gilas, where he earned the MVP award in the 2010 Champions Cup. A year later, he joined the Foshan Dralions in China before returning to the Philippines in 2015 to play for Blackwater Elite, winning the 2015 PBA Commissioners Cup. His last stop in Asia was in 2017, when he played for the Hanoi Buffaloes, a Vietnamese team that competes in the Thailand Basketball Super League.

At the college level, Douthit played under head coach Tim Welsh at Providence College and earned the team's Marvin Barnes Defensive Player Award in his junior and senior seasons. Douthit will use his experience as a collegiate and professional player

and give insight to mold this year's young CCRI basketball squad. He earned his bachelor's degree in Social Science.

Douthit resides in Mansfield, MA.



#### Andy Jackson Assistant Coach/ Strength Coach

One of the more well-respected coaches at CCRI, **Andy Jackson** brings a wealth of knowledge both on and off the court, having trained some of Rhode Island's top high school and college athletes

through the years. Among his most notable clients are former All-American running back Steve Silva of Holy Cross, former Boston College and Indianapolis Colts defensive back Jamie Silva, return specialist and former fourth-round NFL draft pick Will Blackmon of Boston College, former Stonehill College basketball team captain Soap Toun and former Bishop Hendrick and West Virginia basketball standout Joe Mazzulla.

In addition to his duties with the men's basketball team, Jackson trains CCRI athletes in various sports and is known for always going above and beyond the call of duty. As a result, he was named CCRI's Coach of the Year for the 2014-15 season.

Jackson competed actively in bodybuilding and held the titles of Mr. Eastern America, Mr. Boston and Mr. Rhode Island from 1970-72. In 1990, he finished fourth in the Mr. Rhode Island competition. Jackson graduated from Mt. Pleasant High School in 1970 and received a Technical Arts degree from Providence Opportunity Industrial Center in 1974.

Jackson has served as a mentor to area youth for more than 25 years with experience at the Olneyville Boys Club, Washington Park Community Center and John Hope Settlement House. He also coaches in the Providence Recreation Fall League.

Jackson currently lives in Providence.



#### Josh Perry Assistant Coach

Josh Perry returns to the CCRI men's basketball coaching staff for his fourth year after serving as a volunteer assistant during the 2014-15 season.

Perry played two seasons at CCRI from 2010

through 2012 as a backup guard, appearing in 42 games. Last year, Perry helped with statistical entry and aided with game reports for the team. His experience with community college athletics, in addition to his expertise as a player, make him a valued asset to the CCRI coaching staff.

Prior to college, Perry played basketball and ran track at South Kingstown High School.

#### 2019–20 SEASON SUMMARY

It's been more than a year since the last time CCRI's men's basketball team took the court, but the Knights boasted an impressive 2019-20 season before the COVID-19 pandemic rocked the sports world.

That year, the Knights finished 23-12, won their 19th Region XXI Championship, and Knight's earned their 13th trip to the NJCAA Men's Basketball Tournament in Rochester, MN, where their season ultimately ended with a loss to Columbus State. In addition to the team's performance on the court, the 2019-20 season is best remembered for the breakout season by freshman forward Mitchell Noresca (East Providence, RI), one of three Knights to earn All-Region XXI Honors.

Noresca earned the nickname, "Chairman of the Boards," for his rebounding prowess; he hauled in a staggering 523 boards during the regular season, which not only led the region and the nation in Division III, but also set a new single-season program record, dwarfing the 388 rebounds accumulated by Walt "Stretch" Edwards during the 1972-73 season.

Joining Noresca on the All-Region XXI team were Mikey Gamble (Hartford, CT), who earned Second Team honors, and sophomore co-captain Elijah Lewis (Bridgeport, CT), an Honorable Mention. Noresca was also a Second Team selection.

Gamble had a great rookie year with CCRI highlighted by his ability to score anywhere on the court. He scored 509 points, shooting 45.2% from the floor and 38.5% from beyond the arc. Lewis picked up where he left off in his freshman season, closing out his career at CCRI with 138 assists, good for 28th in the nation and an average of 4.6 per game. Offensively, Lewis scored 413 points on the season, averaging 13.8 per game, and shot 44.7% from the floor, including 39.9% from three-point range, which was the 70th best percentage in the country.



#### **SEASON OUTLOOK**

After a couple years of getting acclimated as a college head coach, CCRI Hall of Famer Doug Haynes has put

together a bumper crop of talent on this year's women's basketball roster in his third season at

the helm.

With the pandemic wiping out the 2020-21 season, Haynes will need an influx of talent with only one returning player, sophomore guard **Jazlynn DiZoglio** (Providence, RI). The good news for the Knights is DiZoglio served as a captain in her freshman

campaign in the 2019-20 season and will look to provide leadership and a defense-first mentality to the young 2021-22 squad. DiZoglio will be joined by former Juanita Sanchez teammate and All-Division point guard Michelle Moreno (Providence, RI), who

will serve as one of the team's co-captains.
Joining Moreno is forward **Talia Thibodeau** (Cranston, RI), who earned All-State honors academically at Cranston High School West and will provide mental stability for the Knights.

Leading the influx of top talent is First Team All-Stater and three-sport (field Hockey, basketball and lacrosse) standout **Maggie**  Schwab (North Kingstown, RI), who is poised to make her mark her at CCRI. Schwab earned All-State honors in her junior and senior campaigns at North Kingstown and looks to continue her success at the collegiate level. Two more high-level recruits come to CCRI from St. Raphael Academy – sharpshooter Chloe Rayko (Coventry, RI) and point guard Elizabeth Bruno (Providence, RI). Rayko and Bruno were two key pieces for the St. Raphael team that won a state championship. The combination of Moreno, Bruno, and Rayko will cause fits for CCRI opponents.

Also joining this year's roster, **Jasmine Wilson** (Pawtucket, RI) is an All-Division guard/forward from Shea High School who will add depth to the lineup. Power forward/center Ashley Lima from Cape Verde has size, quickness, and athleticism and will provide depth in the frontcourt while also being a pivotal player on the defensive end with her leaping ability to block shots and quickness to steal the ball. **Kayla Saddler** (West Warwick, RI) and **Anayah Melgar** (Coventry, RI) are combo guards who are very quick on defense while also possessing the ability to knock down a three-pointer when needed. **Taylor Enright** (West Warwick, RI) is another player who can do a little bit of everything; Enright has the size to get rebounds and post up in the paint, but also has the acumen to step back and bury a three if the opportunity arises.

With this group of talent on offense, combined with aggressive defense and a fast-paced approach, the Knights have all the tools to accomplish their goal of making a return trip to the NJCAA Tournament this year.

#### Doug Haynes Head Coach

Hall of Fame alumnus **Doug Haynes** returns to CCRI's women's basketball program for his third year at the helm for the Lady Knights.

Taking over just prior to the start of the season, Haynes molded a team of young players – many of whom he did not recruit – and led them a 12-14 record in addition to an appearance in the Northeast District Championship.

Prior to taking over at CCRI, Haynes enjoyed an 18-year career as the head coach at St. Mary's Academy at Bay View. Haynes earned Rhode Island Division I Coach of the Year honors seven times at Bay View in addition to being named the 2014 National High School Federation Coach of the Year. He also won two state championships, five state runner-up titles and seven division championships.

At CCRI, Haynes starred as a two-sport athlete from 1987 through 1989, exceling in basketball and baseball. He was the men's basketball team MVP in 1988 and 1989 and was a two-time All-New England selection and an NJCAA

All-American as a sophomore. He graduated as the fourth member of the school's 1,000-point club and, at the time, the third leading scorer in program history with 1,043 points.

On the baseball field, Haynes earned two All-New England selections as an outfielder and posted a .403 batting average to lead the Knights to a third-place finish in the 1988 NJCAA World Series.

CCRI inducted Haynes into the Hall of Fame in 1995 and named him the 2015 Outstanding Alumni Award recipient. He was also inducted into the West Warwick Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004 and named the Female Sports Coach of the Year by Words Unlimited in 2014.

Haynes also attended the University of Rhode Island from 1984 through 87 before earning his associate degree at CCRI in 1989. He is employed in juvenile corrections at the Rhode Island Training School for Youth in Cranston and lives in North Kingstown.

During her freshman year in 2006-07, Scott led the Lady Knights to regional and district championships in addition to a trip to the NJCAA Elite Eight, the first of her two appearances in the NJCAA Tournament. Scott earned four All-American honors in just two years at CCRI, including preseason and postseason First Team NJCAA honors.

Scott earned a scholarship to play at Le Moyne College in New York in the 2008-09 season and returned to the Ocean State the following year to play for her former CCRI coach, Marcus Reilly, at Rhode Island College.

Scott earned her bachelor's degree in Sociology from Rhode Island College in 2012 and now resides in Riverside, RI.



#### Joel Tuoni Assistant Coach

Joel Tuoni returns to the Lady Knights for his fourth year as assistant coach. Tuoni boasts 32 years of coaching experience in the Rhode Island Interscholastic League, including 28 as a varsity coach in basketball and softball, and was a two-

time Rhode Island Division I Coach of the Year award winner. Tuoni also played at CCRI alongside Haynes and a was a co-captain on the 1988-89 team that won the New England and Northeast Regional Championships and appeared in the NICAA Tournament.

Tuoni lives in South Kingstown, RI.



#### Victoria Wilkerson Assistant coach

**Victoria Wilkerson** returns to the Lady Knights coaching staff for her seventh season, her second as a full-time assistant after spending three years as a volunteer.

Wilkerson graduated from Pilgrim High School and attended both Southern

Vermont College and Rhode Island College, studying in Liberal Arts and Psychology, respectively.

She currently works at The J. Arthur Trudeau Memorial Center and resides in Warwick.

#### 2019–20 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL SUMMARY

In their last season before the COVID-19 outbreak, the Knights finished 6-24 in a rebuilding year under then second-year head coach Doug Haynes. Though they only won six games, it was evident on the court that Haynes was beginning to turn the program in the right direction in his effort to develop CCRI into a formidable adversary in the northeast for many years to come.

The season got off to a strong start when CCRI beat Thomas Nelson at the Fredrick CC Tip-Off Tournament then returned to Warwick to defeat Bunker Hill CC for their first home victory. Following an early-season win over Orange County CC, the Knights went on an eight-game skid, which painfully taught the young roster many valuable lessons about valuing the ball, team defense, and maintaining intensity throughout the game.

CCRI eventually snapped its eight-game losing streak with a win over Bristol CC, but followed that with nine consecutive losses. Through it all, the Knights continued to play hard and battle until the final whistle despite not getting the results they desired. CCRI finished January with back-to-back wins over Ulster County and Gateway CC, which, ultimately, were there final wins of the season.

Despite the record, it was easy to see the potential in many players on Haynes' roster in addition to the coach's vision for the future. It won't take long for Haynes to recruit the talent necessary to match his desired style of play his past teams were known for. That, with his reputation as a tireless worker and his thirst for finding new, local talent, should set up the Knights for an eventual run at a Region XXI title in the near future.
