This summer, selected undergraduate and graduate students will complete assignments supporting the DHS cyber mission over the course of 10 weeks.

Through this program, students currently pursuing degrees related to cybersecurity have the opportunity to gain first-hand exposure to the cybersecurity work performed at DHS. In addition, they will participate in mentoring and professional development events with DHS managers and senior leaders.

Students selected for the current cohort will receive a stipend and complete assignments in the Department's Office of the Chief Information Officer.
