All CCRI students are required to take the ACCUPLACER placement test before registering for classes. If the test shows that you need to strengthen your math skills, you'll need to enroll in MATH 0095, our **"Developmental Math Emporium."**

The **Math Emporium** at CCRI is a new and innovative classroom model where students can master developmental math topics needed for credit bearing courses. Using ALEKS, an artificially intelligent assessment and learning system, and individual, on demand, one-on-one instruction from faculty members, students will have the opportunity to complete all of their developmental course work in one semester.

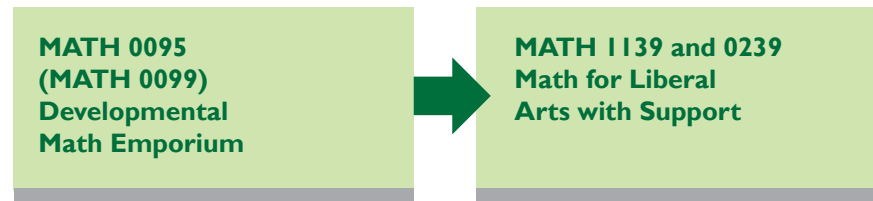

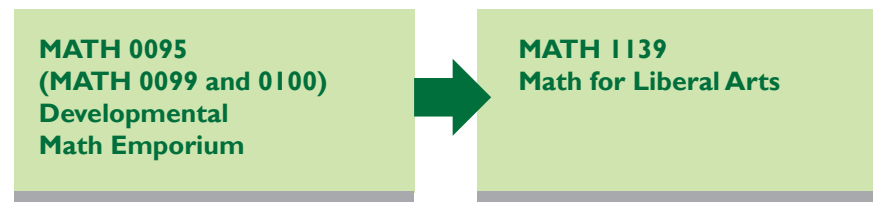
