NOTES: 1. CCRI students who complete the Liberal Arts associate's degree with at least 60 credits and a minimum GPA of 2.0 will be guaranteed admission into the Providence College SCE degree programs listed above. Students must earn a grade of "C" or better to earn transfer credit for a course.
2. Providence College will waive the $\$ 55$ application fee for students who meet the above requirements.
3. Students must fulfill the School of Continuing Education's core curriculum requirements; complete the residency requirement of a minimum of 45 credits in Providence College SCE; and earn at least $50 \%$ of their major credits with Providence College SCE coursework.
4. Most students transferring in with the Associate's in Liberal Arts will need approximately 60 credits to complete the bachelor's degree.

The remainder of the CCRI free elective credits will be applied to the free electives component of the Providence College SCE bachelor's degree programs included in this agreement. Thirty-six (36) free electives are permitted in the B.A. History program.

Typically, courses from the following departments are accepted by PC SCE: accounting, art, astronomy, biology, business administration, chemistry, Chinese, computer studies and information processing (COMI and COMP), economics, emergency management, English, engineering, fire science, French, geography, geology, German, history, human services, Italian, Japanese, law, mathematics, manufacturing, music, networking certification (CSCO), oceanography, philosophy, physics, political science, Portuguese, psychology, Army ROTC, Russian, sociology, Spanish, speech, and theater.

On a case-by-case basis, courses taken in electronics technology, engineering technology, and as part of a health science or administrative science major will need to be reviewed by a PC SCE adviser before granting credit.
