

THEATRICAL MAKEUP

Modern theatrical makeup is hypo-allergenic. However, caution must be taken when using it, and most especially when using “street” makeup as part of the design.

- After receiving the makeup kit, test all components on your forearm to ascertain if there are any allergic reactions. If you have a reaction, report this to the instructor.
- If you have a latex allergy, do not use liquid latex or any latex-containing makeup.
- Do not share makeup or brushes. Disposable paper cups and washable palettes are provided for portioning out makeup from the general makeup kit.
- Sanitize all lip products with alcohol, as demonstrated by instructor.
- Wash all brushes, palette knives, modeling tools, and other implements with hot, soapy water after each class use.
- Do not ingest any makeup components. (Lipsticks are a special formula that is safe for use on the lips).
- Do not use any makeup components in or around the eye area unless approved by the instructor.
- Do not use any aerosol or compressed air sprays in the dressing rooms.
- All fans and makeup station lights must be turned off at the end of class.
