- I. Call to Order --- Meeting called to order at 9:05 a.m.
- II. Roll Call --- Attendance was taken and a quorum was present.
- III. Approval of Minutes was postponed to the next meeting as they were posted, but not included with the agenda by email.
- IV. Item Report from Chair Sneesby
 - a. Announcements-Chair Sneesby discussed the Raising Opportunities fundraiser; Anyone who would like to attend and sit at a Senate table should contact Chair Sneesby or Senator Josephs. The date is April 28, 2023.
 - b. Full faculty meeting survey- The Chair reviewed faculty comments from survey, and she will compile the comments into a document to share at the next meeting.
- V. Item Report from Vice Chair Friel

Vice Chair Friel introduced Senator Stockford, who reviewed the election procedures. Those interested in continuing their terms can do so. Those wanting to step down or run for a place in the leadership, can do so.

VI. Item – Senate Bill S. 2023. ATC-001

A Bill for LMS Usage- All courses will maintain an active course site using the LMS.

Motion: To approve Senate S. 2023. ATC-001- A Bill for Learning Management System

a. Discussion: After Senator O'Neil discussed the origin of the bill and the revision of the bill according to concerns were raised by others about student access and consistency. Concerns were raised about courses that were outliers (such as Math Emporium), for the rollout of a new LMS, for merged courses, and for issues of accessibility. Clarification of an active course site was defined as an

- c. Approved: 27 yes I no I abstention

VII. Item - Report of Standing and Special Committees

- a. Senator Kilduff- Academic Standards and Policy (ASP) Senator Kilduff explained that the grading policy that was sent out through email and elicited much discussion was, in fact, the wrong policy. Currently, the ASP committee will bring the corrected version to the Senate. He also discussed the "Cproblem" on the rating system/grading policy, along with an explanation of other problematic grading policies, such as the W/WP/WF, that need to be addressed.
- b. Senator O'Neil- Academic Technology (AT) AT is focused on tech accessibility for students (e.g., supporting student access to loaned devices and supporting student access to course materials). After meeting with the instructional design team and DSS, the committee suggests that the college, itself, create a policy for accessibility that would consider all the necessary stakeholders and potential issues and concerns (e.g., DSS concerns, DEI issues, budget issues, IT issues, DL outcomes, etc.).
- c. Senator Lynch- Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Senator Lynch discussed the committee's work on an inclusive syllabus goal. In addition, they are working to create shared goals with the DEI Council in order for their work to compliment and support each other.
- d. Senator Levitre- General Education Gen Ed reports a set of courses was approved. They are using the new CIM (Curriculum Inventory Management) system. In addition, they are currently updating the website. In addition, a set of instructions will be developed to explain the process for Gen. Ed. Course approval for faculty and departments.
- e. Senator Swithers- Online Learning (OL) OL is reworking the Online Quality Bill. Senator Swithers discussed creating more EPTO (Effective Practices in Teaching Online) training levels that can help faculty continually build their skills in online teaching. In addition, the committee is approaching ways that DL courses could have consistent online shells.
- f. Senator Galeshaw- Student and College Success (SCS) SCS is ready to put forward a proposal about new student orientation/onboarding. A public hearing for this proposal will be held at the next SCS meeting. After the

hearing, the committee will reconsider the proposal and, if it passes committee, it will be brought before the whole Senate for approval.

- g. Senator Hart- Teaching and Assessment (TA)
 Currently, there are three academic reviews for departments coming up: Criminal
 Justice and Law, Education and Special Education, and Social Services. TA is also
 working with OL on the Online Quality Bill.
- h. Senator James- Co-Chair, Compressed Term Committee
 James gave a brief overview of the charge of the committee. There is a three-phase
 process the committee will undertake to explore a variety of term options, including
 research, piloting, and collective bargaining/labor issues. The overall charge of this
 group of representative faculty and deans is to offer two options of schedules to the
 VPAA for her consideration. The group intends to keep the process transparent and
 keep the college community updated on the committee's progress.

VIII. Item – Report from President Hughes

- a. President Hughes shared her report, which focused on transfer. The President shared information about a meeting on the state level focused on the importance of transfer; discussed RIC articulation meeting; acknowledged the faculty's work in strengthening transfer; President Hughes shared some important points regarding transfer:
 - 1) Clear pathways of Gen Ed courses
 - 2) Guaranteed admission to sister institutions
 - 3) Affordability
 - 4) Strong buy-in from all state higher education institutions
 - 5) Minimizing barriers to transfer for students
 - 6) JAA participation is up 56 percent up from last year (65% jump in URI transfer; 45% jump in RIC transfer)
- b. After her remarks, President Hughes and VPAA Costigan responded to related questions from Senators.

IX. Motion to Adjourn

- a. Motion to Approve: Senator Stockford 2nd: Senator Brewer
- b. Approved by unanimous consent.
